
## Number of Rejected Authentication and Apostille Requests (FY 2015-16 – FY 2018-19)<sup>47</sup>

Under Section 26-1-230, the Secretary of State must reject a request for an Authentication or Apostille in certain circumstances. For example:  $\upsilon$  The Secretary of State cannot authenticate documents that are not signed by a South Carolina public official.  $\upsilon$  The Secretary of State cannot authenticate documents if the Secretary has cause to believe that the authentication is sought for an unlawful or improper purpose (e.g. Sovereign Citizen documents).  $\upsilon$  The Secretary of State cannot authenticate photocopies or documents that do not contain notarial certificate wording.
