- II. The House Legislative Oversight Committee (Committee) was called to order by Chairman Wm. Weston J. Newton on Thursday, February 5, 2015, in Room 516 of the Blatt Building, Columbia, South Carolina. The Committee met immediately upon adjournment of the House. Chairman Newton made brief welcoming remarks and general announcements. All Members were present for the meeting.
- III. The Committee heard a presentation from State Inspector General Patrick Maley. State Inspector General Patrick Maley answered questions from Members.
- IV. The Committee heard a presentation from Mr. Frank Rainwater, Executive Director of the South Carolina Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office. Mr. Les Boles was also in attendance at the meeting from the South Carolina Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office.

- V. The Committee heard a presentation from Mr. Richard H. Gilbert Jr., CPA, Interim State Auditor. Mr. Gilbert answered questions from Members.
- VI. The Committee heard a presentation from Ms. Marcia A. Lindsay, Deputy Director of the South Carolina General Assembly Legislative Audit Council. Ms. Lindsay answered questions from Members.

VIII. The Committee further discussed organizational matters, including changing the priority for legislative oversight and investigation for the Economic Development, Transportation, Natural Resources and Regulatory Subcommittee.

General's Office (Executive Subcommittee), Department of Consumer Affairs (Economic Development, Transportation, Natural Resources, and Regulatory Subcommittee), First Steps to School Readiness (Education and Cultural Subcommittee), Department of Juvenile Justice (Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Subcommittee), and Department of Social Services (Healthcare Subcommittee). Chairman Newton further noted that these agencies were listed in alphabetical order in the House Journal, and the House Journal did not establish a priority or order for these agencies.

Chairman Newton noted that roads are a pressing concern for many constituents. Representative Ralph W. Norman made a motion to change the priority for the Economic Development, Transportation, Natural Resources and Regulatory Subcommittee as stated by Chairman Newton from the Department of Consumer Affairs to the Department of Transportation.
