























# **Budget Reduction Effects – System Office**(50.4% reduction)

- Staffing Reduction 43.8%:
  - Reduction in force of 28 filled FTE positions and 10 vacant FTE positions
  - Retirement and Separation Incentives 12 FTE positions
- Mandatory furlough for all employees in FY2008-2009.
- 22% reduction in operational overhead, travel, supplies, and contract renegotiations
- · Elimination of ALL contingency and reserves




# **Budget Reduction Effects-Technical Colleges**(50.4% reduction)

- Eliminate and/or reduce programs across the System
  - Nursing and EMT, Criminal Justice, Human Services, Industrial Engineering
  - Increase class load for faculty, Increase class sizes, replace full time faculty with adjunct faculty
- Reduction in force of 74 filled FTE positions, 94 vacant FTE positions (4% faculty and staff reduction), and 29 temporary positions
- Mandatory furlough for employees in many of the colleges
- Reduction in operational overhead, travel, supplies, professional development, training, registrations, marketing, custodial services
- Elimination of equipment replacement for classrooms and labs
- Elimination of contingencies and reserves

### **FY 2011-2012 Legislative Priorities**

#### **Maintain Base Funding**

Ensures that the System and its 16 technical colleges across the state remain able to sustain the increasing number of South Carolinians seeking education and training.

#### **Lottery Tuition Assistance - \$47m**

Provides access to affordable higher education and training necessary to enter or remain in the workforce.

Center for Accelerated Technology Training and readySC™ - \$9.1m Ensures that funds are in place to assist eligible new and expanding companies in meeting their workforce needs in the upcoming year.

### **FY 2011-2012 Legislative Priorities**

#### **Allied Health Initiative**

Allows the colleges to meet critical allied health workforce demands as well as continue those services already in place.

#### **Lottery Technology Funding - \$5m**

\$5 million of the \$12 million is provided to the technical colleges so classrooms can better resemble workplaces.

#### **Technical College System Administrative Efficiencies Act**

This Act sets forth enabling legislation for administrative relief to be granted to the State Board for Technical and Comprehensive Education.
