### **S 1021 (Rat #0428) General Bill, By Washington**

A Bill to amend the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Section 17-13-55 so as to provide for the responsibility for the costs of medical care for an arrested person and to amend Section 20-7-3230, as amended, relating to institutional and detention services for juveniles, so as to further provide for the cost of providing certain medical services to juveniles in Department of Juvenile Justice facilities.-amended title
