H 3995 Joint Resolution, By Quinn

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to Article III of the Constitution of South Carolina, 1895, relating to the Legislative Department by adding Section 15A, so as to require that a Bill or Joint Resolution of the General Assembly imposing or increasing a tax must receive the approval of two-thirds of the membership of the House of Representatives and two-thirds of the membership of the Senate; and by proposing an amendment to Section 21, Article IV, relating to the authority of the Governor to veto a Bill or Joint Resolution, so as to increase from two-thirds to three-fourths the number of votes required to override his veto in each House if the Bill or Joint Resolution increases taxes.
