Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill enacts the “South Carolina Regulatory Reform Act” by adding Section 1-23-122 that states the General Assembly cannot modify the language of a regulation submitted for review by an agency. In order for changes to a regulation to be approved, there must be an affirmative vote from the majority of each legislative body. The amendment deletes the language of the one hundred twenty day period for automatic approvals.
