Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 10, 2017 State Expenditure

This bill makes changes to the licensure requirements for hospice providers. A hospice that wishes to expand its licensed service area to include additional counties must first notify and then receive approval from the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC). A hospice may not establish, conduct, or maintain multiple locations or represent itself as such without first registering the multiple locations with DHEC. The department indicates that this bill does not significantly change the agency's current procedures for licensing hospice providers, and therefore will have no impact on the agency's expenditures.
