### **Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill as amended specifies the tasks that can and cannot be delegated to a certified medical assistant (CMA) by a physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse, and amends the list of tasks that can and cannot be delegated to unlicensed assistive personnel (UAP) by a physician or physician assistant. This bill as amended will have no expenditure impact on the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) as it does not materially impact the operations of the agency or its boards.
