Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill requires the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to allow Sunday hunting on wildlife management area lands owned by DNR or leased from the USDA Forest Service. Further, this bill establishes that any regulation submission by DNR dealing with Sunday hunting shall first receive a majority vote of approval by the House Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Environmental Affairs Committee before being sent to the Regulations and Administrative Procedures Committee.

This bill will have no fiscal impact on the House of Representatives, including the Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Environmental Affairs Committee, and DNR, as any additional costs can be managed within existing appropriations.
