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AGENCY VISION	<p>In fulfilling the above USC Salkehatchie Mission Statement, we look to the tenets of the USC System statement for the overarching vision for our interrelationships with, and contributions to, our service area. USC Salkehatchie aspires to be a leader among the university’s Palmetto College campuses as a comprehensive learning center offering equal access to high-quality university programs and services. USC Salkehatchie must be a dynamic, forward-looking and proactive institution of higher learning that relates productively to its community and to the greater University of South Carolina. USC Salkehatchie seeks continuously to enhance its intellectual environment and expand access to its academic programs.</p> <p>Several years ago, the University Board of Trustees adopted Focus Carolina 2023 as its latest strategic plan. The plan was directly applicable to the Columbia campus of the USC System. USC Salkehatchie, as a regional Palmetto College campus, is accredited as part of USC Columbia. Therefore, Palmetto College created a corollary Palmetto College 2023 plan which takes the goals of the USC Columbia plan and adapts them to represent how the Palmetto College campuses and programs best serve our different stakeholders, thus fulfilling our role in the University System. The corresponding Palmetto College linking goals are: Educating future leaders and thinkers through affordable, flexible, and quality educational opportunities; Assembling and supporting a diverse world-class faculty dedicated to teaching, scholarship, and student success; Spurring creativity and innovation, including advanced educational opportunities responsive to</p>
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regional community needs; Building inclusive and inspiring communities, on-campus and online and Promoting recognized institutional excellence.

Upon his arrival in summer 2019, President Bob Caslen initiated a new strategic planning process in which Palmetto College representatives were actively engaged. Approved by the Board of Trustees in June 2020 and titled *For South Carolina: A Path to Excellence*, this plan represents the goals, objectives, and developing metrics to ensure forward movement by the entire University system for the next five years. With the plan having just been introduced, USC Salkehatchie, as part of Palmetto College, is incorporating selected goals and objectives that closely align with the 2023 plan, and will utilize the 2020-2021 academic year (as part of a larger Palmetto College effort) to fully align the plan’s most applicable goals with those of the campus.

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AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

USC Salkehatchie is a dynamic regional campus serving the rural Lowcountry. The University is one of the anchors in the community and a key for future growth and prosperity in a region characterized by widespread poverty and a declining population. Despite challenges inherent to its region’s economic conditions, USC Salkehatchie successfully strives to meet lofty goals. In line with the flagship’s previous Focus 2023 strategic plan, as well as Palmetto College’s tailored version of it, USC Salkehatchie has sought excellence in five key areas: educating future thinkers and leaders; assembling and supporting a diverse world-class faculty; spurring creativity and innovation/being responsive to community needs; building inclusive and inspiring communities; and promoting recognized institutional excellence. A new USC System strategic plan titled “For South Carolina: A Path to Excellence,” was just finalized, and Palmetto College is beginning work on its own version. In the meantime, USC Salkehatchie has begun to realign, reinterpret, and recalibrate its goals according to the new system plan. This shift is reflected in the goals established for the current year. The following narrative, however, accords with the 2019–20 plan.

Prior to the analysis of goals, it must be noted that in the latter portion of the 2019-20 fiscal year, various aspects of USC Salkehatchie’s operations were suddenly transformed, diverted, slowed, or arrested by the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite the additional challenges that impacted performance metrics, Salkehatchie has continued to serve its students and be productive in ways that often approached pre-pandemic levels.

Educating Future Thinkers and Leaders (Recruitment, Enrollment, Retention)

Despite the challenges that accompany the region’s economic conditions and declining populations, USC Salkehatchie’s student body has been steady over the past decade, with headcount up very slightly (approximately 1%) from Fall 2009 to Fall 2019, and full-time enrollment down slightly (approximately 1%) during that same period. Such stability despite considerable headwinds is attributable to program expansions in athletics and academics and to aggressive recruiting, which has enabled the institution to attract a larger percentage of a shrinking market. Enrollment growth is both a short-term and long-term focus for USC Salkehatchie, and the move toward a larger student body is balanced with a desire to recruit and retain students committed to learning. USC Salkehatchie serves as an alternate access point to higher education for students whose situations—whether economic, personal, or academic—will not allow them to begin immediately at a four-year campus. At USC Salkehatchie’s 2020 Commencement, 125 A.A. or A.S. degrees were awarded to students. Furthermore, the expansion of academic offerings through Palmetto College is enabling Salkehatchie to serve more students locally for longer. While many students pursue baccalaureate degrees at other institutions after completing the first two years of higher education at Salkehatchie, many others are now taking advantage of collaborative programs in nursing and education, as well as Palmetto College online classes, to complete the requirements for baccalaureate degrees without having to leave the Salkehatchie area. USC Salkehatchie’s 2020 Commencement included the awarding of 36 four-year degrees through its partnerships. This number represents students taking advantage of life-changing opportunities. The expansion of academic offerings is essential for the achievement of Salkehatchie’s mission as an institution of higher education. Indeed, Salkehatchie consistently strives to find new and innovative ways to fulfill students’ long-term educational goals and meet the educational needs of its communities. This includes embracing USC’s Graduation with Leadership Distinction (GLD) and overall expansion of experiential-learning opportunities, as well as Salkehatchie’s long-running efforts to form community and local-industry partnerships that facilitate/inspire student internship opportunities and career paths.

Assembling and Supporting a Diverse, World-Class Faculty

Salkehatchie also continues to emphasize faculty excellence by striving to offer competitive salaries; by

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providing opportunities for greater intellectual challenge through the teaching of upper-level courses in Palmetto College; by providing support for engagement in scholarship and research; and by encouraging involvement in campus and local-community service. The greater University has shown support by making internal grant opportunities available to Palmetto College campuses faculty, and the Salkehatchie faculty has responded by regularly winning these grant awards and thereby enhancing their scholarly production/expertise in their fields.

Spurring Creativity and Innovation/ Being Responsive to Community Needs (Faculty/Student Success/Service)

Educational attainment is the cornerstone of USC Salkehatchie’s mission, but community outreach efforts demonstrate the institution's creativity in meeting local needs.

The Salkehatchie Leadership Institute, the community-outreach arm of the university, assists municipalities and community groups with economic development and other projects that strike directly at the quality of life experienced by the residents of the region. Among its many efforts, the Institute sponsors a Take Flight! Aviation Camp for 8th graders from Allendale County and Colleton County. Partnering with The Boeing Company, this camp provides the opportunity for youth in the service area to learn more about STEM fields and explore the aerospace opportunities in our region. This model camp has been recognized nationally as an innovative community partnership. Similarly, the Institute organizes a University of Possibilities outreach effort to promote college attendance to approximately one hundred area middle-school students. The Institute also provides leadership training and development for area high-school students and students participating in USC Salkehatchie student government, as well as providing a yearlong advanced leadership program for civic leaders residing in the six counties of Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell, Colleton, Hampton, and Jasper, sponsored by the local economic development alliance, SouthernCarolina Alliance. The Institute was instrumental in renovations made to the historic Carolina Theatre, accomplished in part through a USDA Rural Development grant, completed in 2013. Since that time, the theater has proved an important space for use by theater classes and has hosted numerous cultural and university events. And during the COVID-19-impacted fall 2020 semester, the theater is being used as a standard classroom as it allows for greater social distancing than standard meeting spaces.

USC Salkehatchie also has played a significant role in the revitalization of the region. Two recent initiatives that demonstrate the institution’s commitment to regional improvement are "University Mile" and a community-based “college town” initiative. University Mile is a streetscape project for downtown Allendale developed with the town and SCDOT. USC Salkehatchie and other community partners brought this project to fruition, and work on this project is nearing completion. USC Salkehatchie is also developing a “college town” approach to growth for both Allendale and Walterboro that has been embraced by both communities. Several years ago, USC Salkehatchie leaders worked with private developers, as well as the county and city, to build The Reserve, a student housing complex on property adjacent to the USC Salkehatchie West campus in Allendale. The facility, which opened in 2015, was ninety percent full during its first year of operation and at last report was at 100% capacity for Fall 2020. A similar partnership for the Walterboro campus was recently launched with "Salk Place" and "Salk Manor" apartments for students in the downtown Walterboro area. Walterboro housing options continue to be expanded.

USC Salkehatchie continues to support faculty members who involve students in internships, independent research, and other modalities of experiential learning. USC Salkehatchie seeks to increase the number of students involved in service learning and Graduation with Leadership Distinction (GLD) honors. Working with the Savannah River Site and other industries, Salkehatchie will identify additional summer internship opportunities for students. Salkehatchie continues to provide campus activities and programs that are designed to enrich the experience of its students and enhance its communities.

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Building Inclusive and Inspiring Communities (Organization/Faculty/Enrollment)

USC Salkehatchie strives to attract faculty, staff, and students from a variety of backgrounds through a welcoming, inclusive, and encouraging campus culture. As a result of its service area, Salkehatchie’s student population is approximately 50% African American, and numerous students of various backgrounds, races, cultures, and creeds attend Salkehatchie. The schools’ athletic programs are a magnet for International students who further enrich the campus environment. Additionally, USC Salkehatchie seeks to recruit and retain faculty and staff from diverse backgrounds, especially underrepresented minorities, through targeted advertising and other methods.

Promoting Recognized Institutional Excellence (Student Success/Faculty/Organization/Planning)

USC Salkehatchie was recently recognized by Niche as one of the top 5 Best Community Colleges in South Carolina. Additionally, USC Salkehatchie faculty has been highly successful with scholarly production and grants. At the time of last report (mid Spring 2020), the faculty had over the previous year 13 scholarly publications, 23 presentations at scholarly conferences, and had successfully applied for 8 internal and external grant opportunities.

To ensure institutional strength, stability, and excellence, USC Salkehatchie is constantly involved not only in systemwide planning, but also in its own long-range planning, work that traditionally occurs in Executive Council, especially during the Executive Council’s fall, spring, and summer retreats. Recent achievements include achieving and maintaining 3 months’ operating budget in reserve; improvements to Allendale and Walterboro facilities, including a long-range plan for renovations that will add useful space to the Walterboro campus; the shuttering and planned demolition of Allendale facilities deemed financial and insurance liabilities; and the continued implementation of PeopleSoft in HR. USC Salkehatchie constantly revisits and enhances institutional planning processes, using assessment methods for continual improvement in administrative support services, including business-office operations, physical plant and maintenance, and university development.

Discussion

USC Salkehatchie continues to have a tremendous impact on its five-county service area, statewide, and beyond. Through participation in, and adherence to, the flagship campus’ and Palmetto College’s strategic planning processes, the institution has important guiding principles and measurable objectives in ensuring it continues to educate and serve its communities and the state. That said, last year’s performance measures were somewhat impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, and the pandemic has necessitated the recalibration of certain goals for the current year.

Data Entry Online Form

USC Salkehatchie has responded using the new data entry web form to the question concerning manual entry of data, which is intended to identify redundant data entry processes across state agencies. USC Salkehatchie has ascertained that because the Palmetto College campuses data-entry systems are internal within the larger University of South Carolina system, none of our data-entry processes move across agencies per the apparent intent of the inquiry. This includes the following:

- student data such as transcripts, admissions, enrollment, which is available across all USC system campuses through our Banner enterprise student data system;
- employee data such as personnel actions, benefits and payroll processing, tax documents and time entry, which are managed systemwide through the university’s PeopleSoft HR/Payroll (HCM) system

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--financial data such as employee travel, payment requests, procurement requisitions and accounts payable, etc, which are also managed through PeopleSoft Finance system.

Data in the larger University of South Carolina system may move across agencies in the way this report requests, and those data-entry process will be addressed by the University of South Carolina Columbia.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies:

USC Salkehatchie participates in/follows the greater University’s Enterprise Risk Management Program (ERM), which was established with the guidance of International Standards Organization, ensuring that any and all forms of risk are managed in a systematic, transparent, and credible manner. Additionally, USC Salkehatchie’s Executive Council and greater Risk Management Team routinely consider local risks or emergencies and acts/reacts according to the University’s standards. Risk is routinely considered in long- and short-term institutional planning.

At the end of this cycle the institution was greatly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, but campus leaders, working in conjunction with Palmetto College and Columbia leadership, operated with a flexible plan that enabled completion of the spring semester online and created a clear path toward reopening in modified ways in the fall, all with an eye toward protecting employees and the students/communities being served.
