# SMALL BUSINESS

- Serves as the statewide small business connectivity lead. Maintains FAQ resource guide.
- Provides SizeUpSC, a data tool to help businesses make better decisions around competitiveness.
- Supports small business stakeholders who provide 1:1 technical assistance via StimulateSC, a pilot grant offering.
- Staffs the Small Business Regulatory Review Committee (SBRRC).
- Assists with resource sharing to enhance economic opportunities with mayors in rural areas.



- 5. Starting a Business/Relocating a Business to SC (4%)




# JINNOVATION

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**GOAL:** Support South Carolina companies large and small, new or existing, with any supplier needs they may have.

#### **KEY SUPPORT AREAS**

- ✓ Organizing supplier outreach and B2B matchmaker events.
- ✓ **Maintaining** SourceSC, an online directory of 2,300+ products and services companies to localize the supply chain.
- ✓ **Identifying** SC suppliers via sourcing requests specific supplier search.

# JINTERNATIONAL TRADE

- Provides export advisement and training opportunities for both new-to-export companies and existing exporters.
- Organizes trade missions and trade shows.
- Connects businesses with state and federal export resources.
- Offers grant funding through the Export Incentives Program (STEP/SCOPE).

#### **FY 24 Statewide Outcomes**

- Assisted 72 small-to-medium-sized companies looking to enter new markets or increase exports.
- Utilized \$375,000 in grants for business export opportunities.
- Return on investment equals \$12 million in reported export sales from participating companies.

### EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

# S.C. Commerce is the lead agency for the coordination of all Emergency Support Function-24 which:

- Assists with disaster preparedness, response and recovery.
- Connects with business continuity experts.
- Coordinates the Private-Public Partnership Program.
- Assists with post-disaster state reentry certification.
- Provides information for the SC Emergency Business Resources Dashboard.
- Sends ESF-24 Quarterly Newsletter and Disaster/Non-Disaster Alerts.

#### **Recent Outcomes**

**7,344** – SC Emergency Business Resources Dashboard views for the 2024 Atlantic Hurricane Season.

**24** – Disaster Alerts sent to 5,511 newsletter recipients (businesses and industry).

**3** – Farm and Forest Recovery Resource Days held in Aiken, Greenville and Horry counties to provide resources post-Helene for farm and forest producer small businesses.

# SC FRAUNHOFER USA ALLIANCE

# A collaborative effort between S.C. Commerce, the SC Council on Competitiveness and the Fraunhofer USA network created to:

- Advance applied research across the state.
- **Connect** companies with colleges and universities, and the research expertise of the global Fraunhofer organization.
- Engage a broad spectrum of businesses.



#### **SC FRAUNHOFER by the numbers:**

- S.C. Commerce provides eligible projects a minimum of 50% matching funds.
- 27 Total number of projects in progress or already completed.
- \$6.5M Total dollars of all projects from 2017 to date.
- Companies Served by County Tier
  - □ 52% 15 out of 29 (Tier 1)
  - □ 28% 8 out of 29 (Tier 2)
  - □ 20% 6 out of 29 (Tier 3)
