

## PbS Outcome Measures

*There are 115 outcome measures for corrections facilities, 65 for assessment facilities and 60 for detention facilities. The outcome measures are grouped into Health, Justice, Order, Programming, Reintegration, Safety, Security and Family.*

<b>Health 01 (C)</b>	Percent of youths presented for admission who had a complete intake screening completed by trained or qualified staff.
<b>Health 02 (C)</b>	Percent of youths presented for admission who had a health intake screening completed by trained or qualified staff in one hour or less.
<b>Health 03 (C)</b>	Percent of youths presented for admission who had a mental health intake screening completed by trained or qualified staff in one hour or less.
<b>Health 04 (C)</b>	Percent of youths presented for admission who had a suicide prevention screening completed by trained or qualified staff in one hour or less.
<b>Health 05 (C)</b>	Percent of youths presented for admission who had an intake screening completed by trained or qualified staff in one hour or less from the time of admission.
<b>Health 06 (C)</b>	Percent of youths presented for admission whose intake screenings were completed by trained or qualified staff before they were assigned to housing units.
<b>**Health 07 (C)</b>	Percent of youths presented for admission whose health assessments were completed by trained or qualified staff 6 months prior to or within 7 days from admission.
<b>**Health 08 (C)</b>	Percent of youths presented for admission whose mental health assessments were completed by trained or qualified staff 6 months prior to or within 7 days from admission.
<b>*Health 11</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicated that they received the health treatment prescribed by their individual treatment plans.
<b>*Health 12</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicate they received the mental health treatment prescribed by their individual treatment plans.
<b>*Health 13</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicate they received the substance abuse treatment prescribed by their individual treatment plans.
<b>*Health 14</b>	Percent of youths whose records indicate that their performance on standardized physical fitness assessments increased between admission and release.

<b>Health 15</b>	Percent of interviewed youths who report receiving at least one hour of large muscle exercise each day on weekdays and two hours each day on weekends.
<b>**Health 16</b>	Percent of youths whose records indicate they have received a physical fitness assessment.

<b>Justice 01</b>	Percent of interviewed youths who report understanding the facility rules and their legal rights.
<b>Justice 02</b>	Grievances and complaints filed per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Justice 03</b>	Grievances and complaints filed per staff per 100 staff-days of employment.
<b>Justice 04</b>	Percent of interviewed youth who report filing a grievance within the last six months who said it was taken care of in some way while at this facility.
<b>Justice 05</b>	Percent of staff filing a grievance within the last six months who said it was addressed.
<b>Justice 06</b>	Percent of interviewed youth who report requesting to see, call or write their attorney and their request was granted.
<b>Justice 07</b>	Attorney visits per 100 person-days of youth confinement.

<b>Order 01</b>	Incidents of youth misconduct that result in injury, confinement, and/or restraint per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Order 02</b>	Staff involvement in administrative sanction over the last 6 months for conduct related to youth (e.g., suspension, letter of reprimand, demotion, etc.) per 100 staff-days of employment.
<b>Order 03 (C)</b>	Physical restraint use per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Order 04 (C)</b>	Mechanical restraint use per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Order 05</b>	Other restraint use per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Order 06</b>	Chemical restraint use per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Order 07 (C)</b>	Restraint chair or restraint bed use per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Order 08 (C)</b>	Isolation, room confinement, segregation/special management unit use per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Order 09 (C)</b>	Average duration of isolation, room confinement, and segregation/special management in hours.
<b>Order 10 (C)</b>	Percent of isolation, room confinement, and segregation/special management unit cases terminated in four hours or less.
<b>Order 11 (C)</b>	Percent of isolation, room confinement, and segregation/special management unit cases terminated in eight hours or less.
<b>Order 12 (C)</b>	Average number of idle waking hours per day. Hours youth spend in their rooms or dormitories during an average 24 hour period not including eight hours for sleeping.

<b>*Programming 01</b>	Percent of youths confined for over six months whose math scores increased between admission and discharge.
<b>*Programming 02</b>	Percent of youths confined for over six months whose reading scores increased between admission and discharge.
<b>Programming 03</b>	Percent of youths whose records indicate that they received a math test.
<b>Programming 04</b>	Percent of youths whose records indicate that they received a reading test.
<b>**Programming 05</b>	Percent of youths whose records indicate that they received a vocational assessment by qualified staff.

<b>*Programming 06</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicate that they received the vocational skills programming prescribed by the individual treatment plans.
<b>*Programming 07</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicate that they have completed a vocational skills curriculum.
<b>*Programming 08</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicate that they received the educational programming prescribed by the individual treatment plans.
<b>*Programming 09</b>	Percent of non-English speaking youth who have treatment plans written in the appropriate language.
<b>Programming 10</b>	Ratio of percent of minority staff to percent of minority youth.
<b>*Programming 11</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicate that they received the psychosocial/social skills programming prescribed by the individual treatment plans.
<b>*Programming 12</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days whose individual treatment plans have monthly progress notes.
<b>*Programming 13</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 1 year whose records include an annual summary of treatment progress.
<b>*Programming 14</b>	Percent of released youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicate that they have completed the health curriculum.
<b>*Programming 15</b>	Percent of released youths confined for more than 60 days whose records indicate that they have completed the psychosocial/social skills curriculum.
<b>**Programming 16</b>	Percent of youths whose records indicate that they have received a psychosocial/social skills assessment by a trained or qualified staff.
<b>*Programming 17</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 30 days whose records include a written individual treatment plan, signed by youth and the responsible staff member.
<b>Programming 20</b>	Percent of youths who report that staff are "Very fair" or "Fair" in applying the rules about telephone calls.
<b>Programming 22</b>	Visitation per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Programming 23</b>	The number of community volunteers providing programming in the facility over the average daily population.
<b>Programming 24</b>	Percent of facility programs that engage community volunteers.
<b>Programming 25</b>	Percent of youths who achieve a higher level by the time of release.
<b>Programming 26</b>	Percent of youths who say they understand their facility's level system.
<b>Programming 27</b>	Percent of youths who know what level they are on.

<b>*Reintegration 01</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days, who have signed aftercare treatment plans.
<b>*Reintegration 02</b>	Percent of youths confined for more than 60 days who have finalized and concrete written aftercare treatment plans within 30 days of release from the facility.
<b>*Reintegration 03</b>	Percent of youths undergoing treatment for a chronic or acute illness, injury or medical condition at time of release whose aftercare treatment plan addresses the need for continued (or new) medical treatment.

<b>*Reintegration 04</b>	Percent of youths undergoing treatment for a mental health problem at time of release whose aftercare treatment plan addresses the need for continued (or new) mental health treatment.
<b>*Reintegration 05</b>	Percent of youths undergoing treatment for a substance abuse problem at time of release whose aftercare treatment plan addresses the need for continued (or new) substance abuse treatment.
<b>*Reintegration 06</b>	Percent of youths who have an assigned aftercare case manager within 15 days of entry into the facility.
<b>*Reintegration 07</b>	Average time until aftercare manager is assigned. (negative result = assigned prior to admission)
<b>*Reintegration 08</b>	Percent of youths who have had contact with an aftercare case manager.
<b>*Reintegration 09</b>	Average rate of contacts with aftercare case manager.
<b>*Reintegration10</b>	Average frequency of treatment meetings per youth per month.
<b>*Reintegration12</b>	Percent of youths who know the name of their aftercare case manager and how to contact him/her.
<b>*Reintegration 13</b>	Percent of youths whose home has been assessed to determine its suitability for future placement.
<b>*Reintegration 14</b>	Percent of youths with contacts between parents/guardians and aftercare case manager.
<b>*Reintegration 15</b>	Percent of youths for whom an aftercare related home visit was made.
<b>*Reintegration 16</b>	Percent of youths who have been referred to community-based service(s).
<b>*Reintegration 17</b>	Percent of youths who needed follow-up treatment and were referred to at least one community-based service as outlined in their aftercare treatment plan.
<b>*Reintegration 18</b>	Percent of youths who needed follow-up health treatment and were referred for health care as outlined in their aftercare treatment plan.
<b>*Reintegration 19</b>	Percent of youths who needed follow-up mental health treatment and were referred for mental health care as outlined in their aftercare treatment plan.
<b>*Reintegration 20</b>	Percent of youths who needed follow-up substance abuse treatment and were referred for substance abuse treatment as outlined in their aftercare treatment plan.
<b>*Reintegration 21</b>	Percent of youths who have been accepted/admitted to at least one community service/agency program prior to release.
<b>*Reintegration 24</b>	Percent of interviewed youths who know they are going to a community service/agency program upon release.
<b>*Reintegration 25</b>	Of those who know they are going to a program, the percent of youths who know the name and have information about the community services/agency staff he/she has been linked with before release.
<b>*Reintegration 29</b>	Percent of youths getting authorized leaves/passes/furloughs from the facility.
<b>*Reintegration 30</b>	Percent of non-English speaking youths who have reintegration plans written in an appropriate language.

<b>Safety 01</b>	Confirmed cases of abuse or neglect over the last six months per 100 days of youth confinement.
<b>Safety 02 (C)</b>	Injuries to youths per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Safety 03 (C)</b>	Injuries to staff per 100 staff-days of employment.
<b>Safety 04 (C)</b>	Injuries to youths by other youths per 100 person-days of youth confinement.

<b>Safety 05 (C)</b>	Injuries to youths by staff per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Safety 06 (C)</b>	Suicidal behavior with injury by youths per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Safety 07 (C)</b>	Suicidal behavior without injury by youths per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Safety 08</b>	Percent of days during collection month when population exceeded design capacity by 10% or more.
<b>Safety 09 (C)</b>	Average daily ratio of direct care staff to youth during the collection month.
<b>Safety 10 (C)</b>	Youths injured during the application of physical and/or mechanical restraints per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Safety 11 (C)</b>	Assaults and fights on youth per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Safety 12 (C)</b>	Assaults on staff per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Safety 13 (C)</b>	Percent of interviewed youths who report that they feared for their safety within the last six months at this facility.
<b>Safety 14 (C)</b>	Percent of staff who report that they feared for their safety within the last six months.
<b>Safety 15</b>	Percent of interviewed youths who report that they were forced to engage in sexual activity within the last six months...while at this facility.

<b>Security 01 (C)</b>	Completed escapes, walk-aways and AWOLs per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Security 02</b>	Attempted escapes per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Security 03 (C)</b>	Incidents involving contraband (weapons) per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Security 04 (C)</b>	Incidents involving contraband (drugs) per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Security 05 (C)</b>	Incidents involving contraband (other) per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Security 06</b>	Incidents involving lost keys per 100 person-days of youth confinement.
<b>Security 07</b>	Incidents involving lost tools per 100 person-days of youth confinement.

<b>*Family 01</b>	Percent of youths whose records indicate an assessment of the strengths and needs of their families and social supports was completed.
<b>*Family 02</b>	Percent of families who report being invited to a program or event at the facility.
<b>*Family 03</b>	Percent of youths who have ever had visits with parents or guardians while in facility.
<b>*Family 04</b>	Percent of youths who report that they have had phone contact with parent or guardian.
<b>*Family 05</b>	Rate of contact between facility staff and youth family in the last full month (including phone, email and/or visit).
<b>*Family 06</b>	Percent of families who report staff value their opinion regarding their child's rehabilitation.
<b>*Family 07</b>	Percent of youths who report their family and staff generally get along with each other.
<b>*Family 08</b>	Percent of staff who value family members and social supports as partners in their work with the youths.
<b>*Family 09</b>	Percent of youths whose treatment plans included family members as a resource to help meet their treatment plan goals.
<b>*Family 10</b>	Percent of youths who report they have at least one person at home or in the community they will talk to when they need to talk or need help working out a problem.

*Family 11	Percent of youths whose aftercare plans include identification of people who will support the youth in the community.
*Family 12	Percent of families who report they are prepared for their child to come home.

<b>Health 01</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period who had complete medical intake screening conducted by a trained and qualified staff member.
<b>Health 02</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period who received a complete medical assessment within seven days of admission.
<b>Health 03</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period who received a complete physical examination within seven days of admission.
<b>Health 04</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period receiving medical treatment and/or medication with documented monthly review and revisions to treatment plan.

<b>Justice 01</b>	Percent of youths reporting they understand program rules.
<b>Justice 02</b>	Percent of youths reporting they understand their legal rights.

<b>Mental Health 04</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period with mental health assessments whose treatment plans reflected integration of assessment.
<b>Mental Health 05</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period with substance abuse assessments whose treatment plans reflected integration of assessment.

<b>Programming 01</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period with initial assessments completed within the first 30 days at the program.
<b>Programming 02</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period with individual service plans developed within the first 30 days at the program.
<b>Programming 03</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period with individual service plans reviewed monthly.
<b>Programming 04</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period whose math testing scores increased from admission to discharge.
<b>Programming 05</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period leaving the program after successfully completing discharge plan.
<b>Programming 06</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period participating in vocational programs who earned a certificate or otherwise demonstrated competency.

<b>Reintegration 02</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period with discharge plans that include documentation of monthly or periodic review and revision.
<b>Reintegration 03</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period referred and accepted or formally linked to a community agency/service.
<b>Reintegration 04</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period with in-person contacts with family service workers/case managers before leaving the program.
<b>Reintegration 05</b>	Percent of youths released since the end of the previous data collection period whose education information was passed on appropriately (e.g., sending the transcript or through a placement team meeting).

<b>Security 03</b>	Percent of unplanned discharges resulting from escape, AWOL, re-arrest in the community or new sentence.
<b>Security 04</b>	Number of incidents involving drugs.
<b>Security 05</b>	Number of incidents involving weapons.
<b>Security 06</b>	Number of incidents involving other contraband.
