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AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Founded in 1849, the South Carolina School for the Deaf and the Blind (SCSDB) was established with a purpose to provide specialized educational programming to a small number of students with hearing disabilities. Today, SCSDB serves students with sensory impairments to include deaf/hard of hearing. blind/visual impairment, and sensory multi-disabled. SCSDB provides educational programming and services to students with sensory disabilities in South Carolina in order to assist these students to realize their maximum potential through high quality educational programs, outreach services, and partnerships. In order to Embrace the Possibilities for every child, SCSDB serves children with sensory disabilities statewide. On campus, SCSDB provides a regular school day program for students. In addition to the instructional day program, SCSDB offers a full residential program to students that provides for the development of the whole child. Transportation is provided daily for local students. Additionally, residential student transportation is provided statewide to and from the home county to campus on a weekly basis. Students are picked up on Sunday afternoons and return home each Friday evening. Through Outreach Services, SCSDB provides statewide services in both education and accessibility. These services are offered in the local county to individuals with sensory disabilities, their families, and the professionals who serve them both directly and indirectly. In addition to the main campus in Spartanburg, Outreach Centers are located in Columbia and Charleston. The South Carolina School for the Deaf and the Blind is the state's specialized school for children with sensory disabilities.

For SCSDB, the agency strategic plan is a long-term plan with goals that embody the critical areas in which SCSDB has identified for focus in order to accomplish the mission and vision of the agency.

• **Goal 1:** SCSDB will implement the *Profile of the SC Graduate* for students with sensory impairments by 2022.



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- **Goal 2:** SCSDB will ensure students are served in a safe environment on campus in order to realize their maximum successes by 2020 through a business continuity plan.
- Goal 3: By 2021, SCSDB Division of Outreach services will be the statewide leader for individuals who
 are deaf, blind, or sensory multi-disabled through expanded Outreach services to meet the needs of all
 sensory impaired children across South Carolina.

Goal 1 Update:

For SCSDB, Goal 1 implementation has focused around the *Profile of the SC Graduate* for students with sensory impairments. In the area of ELA performance, 91% of the student population demonstrated improvement as measured by Brigance as compared to 88% in the prior year. In the area of mathematics, 90% of students demonstrated improvement on Brigance as compared to 80% the prior year. For mastery of ELA IEP goals, 88% of students demonstrated mastery as compared to 87% during the prior year. In the area of mathematics, 84% of students demonstrated mastery of Math IEP goals as compared to 83% the prior year. SCSDB is pleased with the progress made this past year; however, a continued focus will be given to student literacy, increasing student communication skills, and improving student performance in written language.

In addition to ELA and math performance, SCSDB recognized a need to continue to focus on student work-based learning experiences and student transition. In the area of work-based learning, 69% of SCSDB participated in work-based learning experiences. For student transition, student placement increased from 41% to 45%. While SCSDB has made great strides in the area of transition, the school is continuing to develop consistent and systematic student supports across campus, including pre-employment services necessary to enable students to secure vocational opportunities in their home districts and to fulfill post-secondary goals. SCSDB has worked diligently to develop a more focused student transition program that honors student strengths and interests while also facilitating authentic work-based learning experiences, promoting self-determination, and strengthening student autonomy. An increased focus has been placed on empowering students as self-advocates with strong self-determination skills. Ultimately, through collaboration with the SC Department of Vocational Rehabilitation and the SC Commission for the Blind, SCSDB strives to develop a seamless transition program that facilitates the integration of students into communities statewide upon completion of SCSDB. Components of the transition program will focus on career awareness, career exploration, career decision-making, career preparation, and career placement.

For the upcoming year, SCSDB will continue to expand project based learning experiences for students. The integration of academic content into career and technology education provides opportunities to enhance student learning and ultimately develop students into life long learners. When students can find value for academic learning through real life experiences, the development of the whole child increases. SCSDB does phenomenal work in "embracing the possibilities" for the children served; however, as a school and campus program, continued efforts will be made to "stretch" student learning to explore additional capacities among students.

In the area of accreditation, SCSDB participated in an onsite review from AdvancED and received full accreditation upon completion of the process. It is important to note that the onsite visiting team was comprised of in state and out of state members with representatives from other deaf and blind schools.

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Goal 2 Update:

For Goal 2, SCSDB continued to focus on the need to review and update business continuity models to ensure students are served in a safe environment. It is important to note that as part of the AdvancED accreditation review, SCSDB received commendations in the areas of leadership and resource management. The team noted the improvements and accomplishments made in the area of technology and encouraged the agency to continue to work to improve student achievement through such technology. The team was also impressed with the availability of instructional resources available for teachers and students and commended the work to continue to improve campus facilities. Currently, SCSDB will begin the process to complete a campus master plan to include a complete facilities study. A great need exist to evaluate current facilities and develop a longrange plan for facilities on campus. Currently, SCSDB recognizes a need for improved and updated dorm facilities, future plans for educational environments that are most conducive to learning, and upgrades to infrastructure and mechanical systems. With aging buildings and failing mechanical systems, a complete master plan will afford SCSDB the ability to plan long term for replacements and improvements. Just this year alone, SCSDB has experienced needs for chiller replacements in two buildings and a school system that has required multiple repairs. With a much needed long range plan, SCSDB will have the ability to focus on improvements, replacements, and preventive maintenance rather systems in need of continuous repair creating system that is more efficient and effective. SCSDB is pleased to report that completion is approaching for the renovation of one building and the construction of a new building for the Applied Academic Center, which provides Career and Technology Education programming for campus students. These new facilities will allow SCSDB to provide such educational and training programs to students that are accessible and meet the unique needs of the students we serve.

At SCSDB, safety for our students and staff is at the forefront of all that we do. As business continuity models are reviewed and updated, SCSDB is continuing to provide focused training for students and staff. Additionally, SCSDB has worked to stay abreast in this area through participation in such training from those experts in the field as we prepare to conduct a complete review and update to our campus safety plans. Access control systems and recent upgrades to security monitoring are part of current improvement efforts.

Goal 3 Update:

For SCSDB, Goal 3 focuses on the Division of Outreach Services and provides strategic targets to meet the needs of children with sensory disabilities across South Carolina. The Division of Outreach Services includes Early Intervention Services to children and their families in the home setting. Through a partnership with BabyNet, SCSDB has served these children in the past up to age 3. With a critical need to continue such services beyond age 3, SCSDB has worked diligently to expand services up to age 6 to ensure school readiness and continue needed support upon entering the regular school setting. Vision Services and Hearing Services are two other programs in Outreach Services, and in recent years, SCSDB has found difficulty fulfilling school district needs for services for children with sensory disabilities. This past year, SCSDB has focused expansion in staffing in order to meet the continuing needs for services across South Carolina. Additionally, under the Division of Outreach Services, the Instructional Resource Center on the campus in Spartanburg, produces accessible materials for children with visual impairments across South Carolina. The textbook depository for large print and braille textbooks for South Carolina is maintained in the center on campus. SCSDB also produces all braille textbooks for South Carolina public school children in the Braille Production Center through a partnership with the Department of Corrections, and the Braille Production

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Center, which is located at that the Leath Correction Center in Greenwood. In recent years, SCSDB has realized an increase in the need for materials, especially in light of the transition to a new braille code. Thus, the number of inmates working in the center has increased, improvements have been made with equipment and technology, and Leath has afforded SCSDB additional space to accommodate the growing center. For interpreting services, SCSDB has continued to work diligently to recruit interpreters in order to accommodate for requests both on campus and to outside entities.

Below are individual updates to Goal 3. It is important to note that although the strategic plan has focused on areas of need in Outreach Services, this division also includes a preschool Program, Kelly's Kids, on campus that serves children from Spartanburg County. Additionally, SCSDB, as part of our mission to be a statewide leader in accessibility, has worked to again provide sensitivity and accessibility training to entities across South Carolina. Such training has been provided to law enforcement, corrections, parks/tourism, and the medical community to name a few. SCSDB recognizes that providing such training makes for a more informed South Carolina and ultimately provides communities across our state that understand and will be ready to embrace our children once they complete school.

Early Intervention Update:

Overall, great strides were made this past year in the development of the Early Intervention Program expansion for toddlers up to age 6 and in program service delivery. Throughout the year the Early Intervention ad-hoc planning team worked diligently in creating and preparing a template for expansion that includes not only monitoring enrollment numbers and staffing patterns, but also the development of necessary procedures manual, eligibility criteria and required documents/forms for service plan development in order to meet the requirements for the Early Intervention expansion. Additionally, all four areas of focus have been and will continually be monitored and cultivated to ensure that SCSDB Early Intervention services continue to provide high quality services to families statewide in a timely, efficient, and professional manner.

Vision Services Update:

The principal of Vision Outreach services has worked this year to guide the strategic plan related to Vision Services, to assess district requests for support, and to recruit staff for the program. The two new Teacher of Visually Impaired positions that were requested have been filled. A Teacher of Visually Impaired Mentor/Project Magnify Coordinator has been hired under the Interagency Agreement with the South Carolina Department of Education, and this Teacher of Visually Impaired will also provide services to the Early Intervention program. Vision Outreach services continues to move forward expanding as the market demands while maintaining flexibility to meet the changes in geographic locations.

Hearing Services Update:

The principal of Hearing Outreach services has worked to implement the strategic plan as it relates to Hearing Services and has provided a major focus on staff development, recruitment and retention, as well as on efficiency of service provision and management. Increased staffing will allow for increased services to school districts to meet the increasing need for services. Staff development and training topics will continue to focus on best practices in the field, with specific sequence and emphasis of training topics to be governed by the expressed and observed needs of the existing staff and the program as a whole.

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Interpreting Services Update:

A new statewide Interpreting Services Program Director was appointed in October of 2017. SCSDB Interpreting Services will continue to focus on professional development of full-time and contract interpreters to ensure and enhance quality of services being delivered to students who are deaf and citizens who are deaf throughout the state. The program will extend trainings, workshops, and mentorship opportunities to all interpreters in South Carolina to support their development into qualified, credentialed professionals. A mentorship program will be created to give non-credentialed interpreters the opportunity to enhance their competencies by working with experienced, credentialed professionals. These activities will assist to increase the quality and quantity of interpreters across South Carolina which will allow Interpreting Services to meet both strategic objectives: 3.3.1. Expand Sign Language Interpreters have necessary credentials.

Braille Production Center Update:

Currently the SCSDB Braille Production Center employs eighteen braille transcribers with two positions available. Six of these employees are currently completing the course for UEB certification. The eight remaining transcribers that were certified in EBAE are on the waiting list to test for the Letter of Proficiency. The SCSDB Braille Production Center is in compliance with the implementation process. All textbook production for the South Carolina Department of Education has been provided in the UEB code since the 2015/2016 school year. The BPC Program Manager will ensure that the SCSDB Braille Production Center continues to pursue the direction set forth in the strategic plan. On-going staff development will remain a top priority through the use of training and certifications. This will ensure a highly qualified, specialized, and motivated workforce capable of producing the highest quality textbooks for the students of South Carolina and to our customers nationwide.

Risk Management and Mitigation Strategies

SCSDB's failure to achieve the agency's mission limits opportunities for children with sensory disabilities in South Carolina. The educational objectives at SCSDB are developed using the general educational standards provided through the SC Code of Laws and the interpretation of those statutes by the SCDOE. These objectives focus on continual improvement in SCSDB's ability to provide the highest quality educational programs for the deaf, blind and multi-sensory disabled children that are served throughout the state. Failure to meet these objectives would negatively impact educational services to children. SCSDB continually seeks assistance and guidance from the SCDOE to eliminate any negative impacts. SCSDB appreciates the continued support from the General Assembly to make needed expansion in Outreach Services in order to meet the growing need for services across South Carolina. Additionally, the support provided for a campus master plan will allow SCSDB to develop a long-range plan for facilities and infrastructure. This plan is needed to avoid reactive repairs and provide a safe, accessible, and conducive learning environment for the children served.

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Restructuring Recommendations

The following recommendations include areas identified for potential improvement. The Subcommittee recommended continuing the agency's major programs to include education, student support, residential, outreach, administration, and physical support. Additionally, the Subcommittee recommended the continuation of agency programs and laws relating to the agency with the exception of the following recommendations listed below:

- 1. Agency Purpose: The agency purpose should be added to Title 59, Chapter 47 as follows: The School for the Deaf and the Blind is established to provide educational programs and outreach services to students who are deaf, blind, or sensory multi-disabled.
- 2. Maintenance Fees: Delete Section 59-47-90.
- 3. Annual Report: Delete language from 58-17-100 that would violate FERPA.
- 4. Employee Classification and Compensation: Change 8-11-270 as it relates to exemptions from the State Classification and Compensation for SCSDB to add the following including but not limited to teachers, bus drivers, orientation and mobility staff, occupational therapists, physical therapists, and interpreters.

The Subcommittee did not recommend elimination of any agency programs.
