On behalf of the Healthcare and Regulatory Subcommittee, thank you for providing testimony at our September 16, 2019, meeting. Your testimony about the Vulnerable Adults Fatalities Review Committee's (Committee) purpose and processes was helpful as we learn more about South Carolina's systems to serve and protect vulnerable people. Subcommittee members have some outstanding questions, and would appreciate a response by October 14, 2019.

- On page two of the Committee's 2014 report, it was reported "In 2013, over 8,000 cases of abuse, neglect, and accidents involving the elderly and incapacitated adults from nursing facilities are reported to the South Carolina Long-Term Care Ombudsmen." Please provide the number of cases for 2018, or the most recent year available.
- What state agencies provide resources to support the Committee's work (e.g., meeting space and administrative support)? If possible, please specify the type of resource and quantify the value of the resource?
- If after 2009, deaths from Veterans Affairs (VA) facilities were no longer covered by the investigative scope of the SC Law Enforcement Vulnerable Adult Unit, who investigates these deaths?

The Healthcare and Regulatory Subcommittee approved a finding related to the Vulnerable Adults Fatalities Review Committee. The text of it will appear in the meeting minutes for the September 16, 2019, meeting. Those minutes will be considered for approval at our next meeting. If approved, staff will send you a link to the minutes.
