

## Q5 The legislative oversight process increased legislators' understanding of the agency's programs.










#### Q10 House legislative oversight staff were professional.

# Q11 During the study process (between receipt of Program Evaluation Report Guidelines and approval of the full committee report), how often were you in contact with committee staff?




