AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Values

- We believe in a climate built on trust, integrity and selfless service; therefore we will empower agile and adaptive leaders to create a transparent environment of dignity and respect through the fostering of cohesive teams, shared understanding, and bold action.
- We believe we have a sacred obligation to uphold the reputation of those who came before us, therefore, we will build a culture that embodies the ideals of our military service and the values of our South Carolina roots to deploy, defend, and serve those who are unwilling or unable.
- We believe innovation and partnerships are key to building agile and adaptive forces, therefore, we will encourage and empower all levels of our workforce to improve the processes entrusted to them.

Goals

The guiding principles of the S.C. Military Department are to promote a cohesive, disciplined, and resilient organizational culture, where our people are trained, knowledgeable, and mentor each other in a positive, supportive environment; maintain trained and ready forces for the defense of our country and emergency support of our communities by investing in innovative individual and collective training opportunities and world-class facilities; and strengthen and leverage current relationships while identifying opportunities for mutually beneficial partnerships to maximize future competitiveness. The Agency continued to meet these objectives in FY 23-24, both in terms of overall-mission readiness and service to the citizens of South Carolina. The Agency also continued working toward the achievement of the organization’s strategic goals:

1. Promote a cohesive, disciplined, and resilient organizational culture, where our people are trained, knowledgeable, and mentor each other in a positive, supportive environment.
2. Maintain trained and ready forces for the defense of our country and emergency support of our communities by investing in innovative individual and collective training opportunities and world-class facilities.
3. Strengthen and leverage current relationships while identifying opportunities for mutually beneficial partnerships to maximize future competitiveness.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies

The most significant negative impacts on the State of South Carolina and the public would occur if the Office of the Adjutant General failed in its responsibilities for the provision of emergency coordination and support. The main concerns are the ability to execute early or timely alerts and warnings, and the risk of complex disasters either exceeding or exhausting the Agency’s and State’s resources or capabilities.

In the area of alerts and warnings, the Agency is dependent on State and Federal agencies, counties, and external organizations to provide timely information and alerts to the State for dissemination and decision-making. Short/no-notice events (e.g., earthquakes, train wrecks, chemical spills, etc.) could initially result in a slower, less coordinated response. In addition, delays or reluctance in decision-making at the local, county, State or Federal levels would negatively impact the Agency’s (and State’s) ability to provide timely, effective response and support. The Agency continues to mitigate this by utilizing multiple strategies to include State-level exercises and drills incorporate exercising alert and warning systems, as well as incorporating county and State agencies and leadership into the decision-making aspects of the exercises. SC Emergency Management Division (SCEMD) continues to exercise and validate their communications and alert and warning systems with the counties, State and Federal agencies. SCEMD continues to expand the use of the South Carolina Emergency Manager Mobile App and established social media channels to message, inform, and provide the public with the latest emergency information and to assist in their emergency preparations. Additionally, after action improvements done following each major disaster declaration enables the Agency (and State) to improve alert and warning capabilities.

The State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) is the State’s coordination center for response and initial recovery actions for disasters or multi-county events, and for coordinating National Guard support after all other avenues have been exhausted. In the event of an extremely large or complex event, there is the potential for resource requirements or length of response actions to exhaust both SEOC and National Guard personnel and resources, or to require resources exceeding the Agency’s ability or availability. The Agency utilizes multiple, established, and well exercised strategies to mitigate this challenge. FEMA can provide access to Federal

resources once the State has exhausted its resources. In addition, through the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC), the States can receive or provide state-to-state assistance.

In response to these areas, the Agency recommends the Legislature take action in three areas:

- Ensure the State Emergency Management Program is adequately funded. There is a potential for additional State fiscal support for emergency management programs in the event of a decrease in Federal funding. Federal Emergency Management Performance Grants (EMPG) currently fund almost 50% of SCEMD's budget. SCEMD passes at least ½ of the EMPG Program grant funds to counties as grant allocations ranging from \$53,307 to \$104,740 annually. Unfortunately, a nearly 10% reduction in federal grant funding occurred in 2024 which reduced available funding by \$ 563,100. These reductions will likely reduce SCEMD's and county's capabilities to respond; restrict travel, and decrease preparedness activities such as training, exercises and citizen awareness events. Recent major disasters show the need for a strong, robust State and local level emergency management system.
- Be prepared to provide financial assistance to counties and State agencies. An event which does not meet the threshold for a Federal declaration has the potential to have significant physical and financial impacts on county and local governments, and State Agencies' budgets. In addition, FEMA has indicated that the Federal government is moving toward reducing disaster funding and Federal matching for future events. Neither the counties nor State agencies are positioned to absorb the increased costs.
- Promote and support county emergency management agencies and State agencies participation in State-level drills and exercises in order to exercise communications and decision-making systems, and increase and reinforce familiarity with emergency management systems and processes.

Agency Personnel Strength

As of 30 June 2024, the Agency employed 463 State employees. The South Carolina National Guard (SCNG) was at 100.1% of authorized strength with 10,534 Service Members. The South Carolina Army National Guard (SCARNG) was authorized 9,249 Soldiers with 9,258 assigned (100.4%), and the South Carolina Air National Guard (SCANG) was authorized 1,333 Airmen with 1,334 assigned (100.1%). In addition, the SC State Guard, which includes the Joint Services Detachment, had 375 volunteer members.

South Carolina Emergency Management Division

SCEMD served as the State Coordinating entity for response and recovery activities while preparing for the next emergency or disaster. Work continues to assist and process eligible reimbursements under the Stafford Act in support of on-going recovery operations from the 2015 Severe Flood, 2016 Hurricane Matthew, 2017 Hurricane Irma, 2018 Hurricane Florence, 2019 Hurricane Dorian, 2020 February Severe Weather and April Tornadoes, 2020-2021 COVID Pandemic, 2022 Hurricane Ian, and 2023 Tropical Storm Idalia.

- **Tropical Storm/Hurricane Response**

The State Emergency Response Team (SERT) responded to one tropical event in 2023.

Tropical Storm Idalia formed on 27 August 2024. On 28 August, county and State Agencies began coordinating their efforts throughout the State. The following day, Governor McMaster declared a State of Emergency for South Carolina. The storm strengthened to a Category 4 hurricane before weakening to Tropical Storm on 30 August and impacting South Carolina, bringing strong winds, storm surge, tornadoes and heavy rain that caused damage to over 60 homes. Many areas experienced localized flooding which also caused damage. The State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) activated to Operating Condition 2 (OPCON 2) in order to respond to the storm's impact.

- **COVID**

SCEMD continues to coordinate with eligible applicants to administer FEMA's Public Assistance program with cost estimates for emergency protective measures currently exceeding \$882M. Also, SCEMD can provide support for potential PPE supply shortages with at least a 60-day stockpile capability. A five-year contract is in place until October 2025 for the warehousing, material handling, transportation and response services.

- **Additional 2023-2024 SCEMD Highlights**

- Monitored tropical cyclone activity to include 20 named storms in the Atlantic Basin during the 2023 Hurricane Season, and provided updates to the State Leadership, counties and State Agencies.

- SCEMD coordinated with counties, Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters (VOADs), and partners to support recovery efforts from several hazard incidents that caused localized damage but did not meet the criteria for a Federal disaster declaration under the Stafford Act. These include a December 2023 coastal storm, January 2024 Bamberg tornado, April 2024 Rock Hill high wind and hail event, and June 2024 Berkeley County severe storm. Three of these events resulted in Small Business Administration (SBA) declarations that can provide low-interest loans to residents and businesses with damage.
- Since 2014, SCEMD has processed \$1.4B in eligible Public Assistance (PA) reimbursements (for response costs and public infrastructure repairs/rebuilding) and more than \$88.2M in pre- and post-disaster Hazard Mitigation Grant projects. In the past year, SCEMD’s Mitigation staff worked with State and local agencies to receive Federal grants awards for 18 Hazard Mitigation projects for a total of \$52.6M. Mitigation team members coordinated with State Agencies and partners to secure FEMA approval of the updated State Hazard Mitigation Plan (SHMP), and supported development and Federal approval of seven county/local Hazard Mitigation plans. PA staff worked with eligible State and local agencies and non-profit organizations to receive new FEMA obligations of \$69M for 151 PA projects (for past disasters through Hurricane Idalia in 2023).
- SCEMD secured \$6.4M in Federal capitalization grant funding to establish the South Carolina Safeguarding Tomorrow Revolving Loan Fund (SCSTRLF). The SCSTRLF will provide low-interest loans to local governments to support hazard mitigation projects or to cover the non-Federal cost share for mitigation projects funded through other Federal grant programs.
- Conducted planning workshops with Federal, State, local, tribal and non-governmental agencies to enhance planning and support for the SC Emergency Operations Plan and updated 10 other comprehensive plans and annexes.
- Along with partner State Agencies, affected counties and the State Emergency Response Teams (SERT), coordinated and conducted FEMA evaluated Radiological Emergency Preparedness (REP) exercises with Vogtle Electric Generating Plant and the Catawba Nuclear Station with more than 300 participants. No incidents occurred resulting in offsite emergency response. State REP Plan was reviewed and updated as well as all 12 REP county plans.
- Coordinated and presented 156 training events for more than 2,657 personnel. Developed, coordinated and/or participated in 70 exercises involving more than 3,800 participants.
- Coordinated the State’s participation in the SC Earthquake Awareness Week and the “Great Southeast Shakeout” exercise which included 302,026 registered participants and an aggressive social media campaign focused on earthquake awareness.

State and Agency Response to Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) Requests

During FY23-24, the State of South Carolina provided support to four events in other states through EMAC.

- Texas Border Security – On July 1, 2023, the SC National Guard deployed a total of 150 Soldiers to Texas in support of border security operations. Soldiers completed their mission and re-deployed to South Carolina on August 1, 2023.
- Hawaii Wildfires – From October to November 2023, SCEMD provided virtual A-Team support to Hawaii in response to the wildfire event on the island of Maui. SCEMD managed all EMAC operational support for the period October 11 through November 8, 2023.
- Indiana Solar Eclipse – In April 2024, SC Forestry Commission provided equipment support in the form of three digital VHF radio repeaters to the State of Indiana in support of their response to the April 8 Solar Eclipse event.
- Texas Flooding - In May 2024, the South Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation deployed 16 personnel as a Type 1 Swiftwater Search and Rescue team in response to severe flooding in east Texas for the period May 5 through May 17, 2024.

Construction and Facilities Management

The Construction and Facilities Maintenance Office (CFMO) manages 3.5M square feet of buildings, over 16,000 acres of training land and the fire department at McCrady Training Center, with a combined State and Federal budget of over \$117M for operating and major MILCON construction.

During FY 2023-2024, the CFMO awarded \$13M in construction contracts for renovations to the Laurens and Union Readiness Centers. Designs were completed for renovations to the Wellford and Hartsville Readiness Centers at a cost of \$1.2M with projected construction in FY 25. Additionally, pre-design contracts were awarded for renovations to the Seneca and Clemson Readiness Centers. The CFMO continues to add female restrooms and showers to existing Readiness Centers to meet the requirements of the SCARNG. The Agency completed female restroom additions at Wellford, Abbeville and Batesburg Readiness Centers at a shared State and Federal cost of \$1M. Design contracts were awarded to continue the addition of female restrooms at Eastover, Marion and Varnville Readiness Centers at a shared cost of \$82K. The CFMO began the replacement of the glass storefront on the Greenville Army Aviation Support Facility with a 100% Federally funded project cost of \$892K. The replacement of World War II era barracks continued at Clarks Hill and McCrady Training Centers using only Federal funds. During the Fiscal Year, two barracks were completed and the design of an additional three were started at a cost of \$2.6M. The design to renovate the Olympia Armory (State Guard) was completed and a construction project was awarded using State funding budgeted at a cost of \$4M. The CFMO's efforts result in more efficient and sustainable facility operations and enabled the Agency to provide necessary services to Soldiers and their families while also supporting the local civilian community.

The CFMO continues to manage the future construction of two new Readiness Centers with one located on Joint Base Charleston and one located in Aiken County on the USC-Aiken campus. Construction of the Joint Base Charleston Readiness Center was shifted due to Continuing Resolution timelines and the Congressional addition of \$6.5M in Federal funds. It is scheduled to be awarded in FFY24. The design for the Aiken Readiness Center is in final review with a projected construction date in FFY24. Additionally, the CFMO expects to have bid authority for the Multi-Purpose Machine Gun Range located on Ft. Jackson in FFY24.

The CFMO utilizes the National Guard Bureau's (NGB) "Builder" program to assess facilities to identify and project maintenance needs and prioritizes sustainability projects based on its approved Installation Energy and Water Plan. The CFMO requests Federal Energy funds from NGB to add generator power to coastal and Battalion/Brigade Headquarters facilities. During FY24, Marion and Beaufort Readiness Centers were approved for generators at a cost of \$550K. The McCrady Fire Station, McCrady water well system, and Varnville Field Maintenance Shop were approved for generator design at a total cost of \$67K. These projects will increase sustainability of facilities and the level of support they can provide to Defense Support of Civilian Authorities (DSCA) requirements.

The SC Army National Guard (SCARNG) has a physical presence in 40 of the State's 46 counties. These locations include 62 Readiness Centers, 9 Field Maintenance Shops, 2 Army Aviation Support Facilities, a Combined Support Maintenance Shop, a Unit Training Equipment Site, a Major Training Center (McCrady) with one sub-training site (Clarks Hill), one Close-In Training Area at the Savannah River Site, the SCNG Headquarters Complex, and the Olympia Armory.

Service Member and Family Care (SMFC)

Service Member and Family Care's (SMFC) mission is to posture, promote and provide regionally accessible programs that support Comprehensive Fitness Dimensions and Employment to reduce stressors for Service Members, Veterans and their families, enabling them to thrive personally and professionally.

Employment Services Program

Since October 2011, the Program provided training, connected with employers, and supported the State's Service Members and their families. Through case management and strategic outreach, the Program provides resources and direct support to assist in the successful transition into long-term civilian careers for the State's Service Members, Veterans and Military Families.

- Employment Services - Resume writing, interview skills, job fairs and hiring events, job search and direct placement services, workforce development, higher education and industry-specific training, connections to other relevant programs and veteran service providers.
- Employer Outreach - Job fairs and hiring announcements/events, military-specific training for HR staff and hiring managers, direct referrals based on employer qualifications, opportunities to connect with military job seekers through general HR, and industry-specific training and workshops.
- Operation Palmetto Employment - SC's Military Employment Initiative, supported by the Office of the Governor, serves military job seekers and family members from all branches.

- Outcomes:
 - 467 Service Members, Veterans and family members were placed into new jobs
 - Conducted 238 briefings to units, supported 274 career fairs, and completed 555 resume reviews
 - The unemployment rate for SCNG Service Members continues to be less than 2%
 - By networking with over 1,450 business and community partners, the Program assisted in reducing the unemployment rate of the State's Veteran population by 2.8% in June 2024, ending June 2024 with a 2.9% State unemployment rate for veterans.

Resilience, Risk Reduction, and Suicide Prevention Program (R3SP)

The Resilience, Risk Reduction, and Suicide Prevention Program (R3SP) integrates, educates, and promotes resiliency by synchronizing Soldier, Airman and Family care systems and services to posture and promote consistent Resilience, Suicide Prevention, Sexual Assault Prevention and Response, and Substance Abuse Programs for Service Members and their Families, while maintaining a capability to quickly respond to emergent care needs.

- The Resilience, Risk Reduction (R3) Program had a 90% fill rate for Master Resilience Trainers (MRT). Eight new MRTs completed training, and two more are scheduled to complete by the end of FY24. The SC Army National Guard Suicide Prevention Program (SPP) office has been working diligently to make the community safer. They have successfully operated the LivingWorks START program for five years and hope to make it a Program of Record. The program provides online training on suicide prevention and resource seeking. So far, 1,574 users have enrolled in START, with 883 completing the training. The SPP staff, along with other R3SP employees, also completed additional training to be more alert to signs of suicide and better able to connect individuals with help.
- The Suicide Prevention Program (SPP) aims to become certified facilitators for LivingWorks safeTALK, offering training to Guard members and the community. They have also certified 74 Suicide Intervention Officers (SIOs) to serve at the unit level through workshops using LivingWorks Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) and Ask, Care, Escort-Suicide Intervention (ACE-SI). The SPP has shown a united presence in various events across the State, including American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP) walks and mental health advocacy conferences.
- The Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program credentialed 16 new Victim Advocates and re-credentialed 22 Advocates. The program hosted refresher trainings and specialized events to earn the required Continuing Education Units. Additionally, the Program held a Buddy Aid Facilitator Course, and currently 13 Soldiers scheduled to attend the 80-hour SHARP Foundation Course to become Victim Advocates. The Victim Advocate manning ratio for the State is 88%. For Sexual Assault Awareness Month, the Program facilitated a 3-mile Ruck March.
- The Substance Abuse Program (SAP) provides case management, risk mitigation, and targeted prevention training for substance use and high-risk areas identified by the Unit Risk Inventories (URI). The Program is ranked among the top in the nation for completed URIs and Soldiers trained. With 97 URIs completed and 11 more scheduled, the SAP Team has successfully managed over 50 new referrals, including those in treatment, rehabilitation completions, and discharges.

Behavioral Health Program

The Behavioral Health Program provides counseling, assessment and referrals in supporting the mental health needs of SCNG Service Members, families, and veterans/retirees. Behavior Health Specialists provided assessments, counseling, crises management, and case management for Service Members and their families who are experiencing life stressors or psychological health challenges. During the past year, the Behavioral Health Program reached over 2,200 Service Members, family members and retirees. This total included 9,420 clinical consultations, 544 outside referrals, and 11,550 information and referral consultations. Additionally, Behavioral Health Specialists provided 1,221 counseling/case management sessions, made 25,857 outreach efforts and three Duty to Warn cases. The Behavior health Program has also worked with the Chaplain Corp and the State Law Enforcement Division to develop a responsive and active Peer Support Program for the SCNG.

The State Behavioral Health Specialist reached 341 Service Members, family members, state employees and retirees. This total included 257 clinical consultations, 84 information and referral consultations. Additionally,

the State Behavioral Health Specialist provided 35 counseling/case management sessions and zero Duty to Warn cases. Significant outreach activities included 3 appearances on the Palmetto Guardian podcast and discussing and coordinating a new MOU with the South Carolina Department of Mental Health for 2024.

Family Programs

The Family Programs Office currently offers four programs which included the State: Soldier & Family Readiness Specialist (SFRS), Child and Youth (C&Y) Programs, Personal Financial Counselor (PFC) Program, and the Military One Source (MOS) Program. The Family Programs team continued to provide resources, referrals, engagement and support, and working with Soldiers and Families in various aspects of the deployment cycle. All programs also supported Month of Military Child, Military Spouse Appreciation and Month of Military Family.

- The SFRS Team continues to be work in support of Service Members and Families during deployment, trainings and civilian life. The team closed 589 non-medical support cases while participating in over 808 community and unit-based events. Team provided 6748 quick trackers – quick info for Soldiers, Families and Veterans. The SFRS Team provided training for Unit Commanders and Command Family Readiness Representatives on their Soldier Family Readiness Groups (SFRG) and assistance for recruitment for volunteer involvement. SFRG Volunteers logged 716 hours working with units and continued to support drill weekends. SFRS Team also executed successful Military Spouse Appreciation in May and recognized our Military Families in November. In December the Program supported over 25 Guard Families with Holiday Cheer.
- The C&Y program hosted Camp Bob Cooper serving 96 youth in July 2023. The Program hosted, attended and supported National Guard youth across South Carolina throughout the year. The Program added new events such as Fireflies Holiday Christmas Lights, teen top golf, Hooves and Harvest Festival, and “Soldier for a Day”, and annual events such as deer and turkey hunts, Little Hero's Salute, and minor league baseball games. During the Month of the Military Child (April), the Program hosting three events and serving 171 youth. The Program supported Yellow Ribbon events spreading awareness of resources available to parents and promoting ways to build resiliency and leadership in youth. Recently the C&Y team hosted the Teen Leadership Retreat at Camp Hannon serving 36 youth.
- The PFC Program provided budget/financial planning assistance, including money management techniques, credit score improvement, retirement and estate planning, savings and investing, student loan/tuition assistance, consumer awareness, and pre and post-deployment financial planning for Service Members and families.
- Military One Source is working to support not only National Guard Events, Yellow Ribbons and by providing briefings in the field, but also to provide support to extended Military Family at Fort Jackson, Shaw AFB, Charleston JAFB, Paris Island and Reserve Centers.

Health and Wellness Program

The Health and Wellness (H&W) Program provided no-cost wellness options for Service Members, Retirees, and Family Members. The Program focused on Soldiers who failed to meet the standards of the Army Combat Fitness Test or the Army Body Composition Program, and also provided fitness programs, nutrition guidance, and overall wellness assistance to any Soldier, Family Member, Veteran or Retiree that inquired about our services.

The H&W Program's services included developing individual and unit fitness programs to improve overall health & wellness, mitigate injuries, and increase readiness. With oversight from a Lead Coach, a team of seven regionally aligned Health and Wellness coaches worked to reduce the number of flagged Soldiers by 359. Additionally, the coaches conducted 77 Unit Briefings, 564 Group Training Sessions, and 466 Individual Training Sessions. The coaches connected with 32 Community Partners and attended 35 Community Meetings.

The H&W team offered free access to the TrainHeroic App which allowed the coaches to stay virtually connected with Soldiers, Retirees, and Family Members, and provided workouts they could perform on their own. The coaches currently have 1,509 clients enrolled in the Health and Wellness program and maintains connection with them through in person visits, social media, email, phone calls, text, and the TrainHeroic App messaging system. The coaches also connected with the Holistic Health and Fitness (H2F) System which encompasses the five pillars of Physical, Nutrition, Spiritual, Mental and Sleep to improve overall health. The

connection resulted in an increase in available Soldiers, a more resilient, ready, and responsible Service Member, and a higher readiness posture for the SCARNG.

Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve

Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR) is a DoD program that develops and promotes supportive work environments for Service Members in the Reserve Components through outreach, recognition, and educational opportunities that increase awareness of applicable laws. It provides assistance in resolving conflicts between the Service Members and their employers. ESGR works to create a culture in which all State employers value their employee’s military service resulting in less stress on Service Members and their families.

ESGR volunteers influenced 2,203 employers and 10,557 Service Members serving in the Reserve Components in South Carolina. 101 employers were nominated and presented Patriot Awards, 10 employers received “Above and Beyond” Awards, 2 received “Seven Seals” Awards, 3 employers received the “Pro Patria” Award, and 165 employers signed Statements of Support. During the past year, ESGR Ombudsmen mediated four (4) formal cases and handled 19 informal USERRA inquiries. Committee members logged 1,300 volunteer hours.

Military Funeral Honors

From 01 July 2023 - 30 June 2024, the SC National Guard Funeral Honors teams conducted 2,226 Military Funerals. These funerals were in support of Service Members from all branches of the Armed Forces.

South Carolina Military Museum

During FY24, the South Carolina Military Museum continued its mission to preserve the legacy of the Palmetto State’s military history, build community partnerships, and improve the visitor experience.

In FY24, the Museum’s visitor numbers surpassed 16,000, the highest in the museum’s history, and the education program reached over 2,000 students. The Museum’s K-12 education programs continued to grow and expand, including new digital resources, downloadable lesson plans, and the Museum’s first summer camp program. The STEMsquad Kids Club grew to 300 members and on-site Homeschool programs were offered monthly. The Museum’s internal Facebook boosting/ad marketing plan saw a total of 280,000 impressions and the subscriber rate to the Museum’s eNewsletter has grown to over 1,600 individuals. The Museum continued marketing efforts through billboards, radio advertisements and internal digital media.

The Museum pursued an ambitious exhibition schedule involving original research and a commitment to quality fabrication and relevant interpretive content. In July of 2023, “Developed: Darkroom Photography of the SCNG PAO” opened with a public reception was held in October to honor Phillip Jones, the long-time photographer featured in the exhibition. The curatorial staff re-conceptualized the 19th corridor, covering a wide range of topics including the Civil War, The Citadel and Arsenal Academy, the Mexican-American War, Ballistics and Medicine, and an interactive activity. In January of 2024, an exhibition entitled “South Carolina Veterans and the Civil Rights Movement” opened with a public reception featuring guest speakers including U.S. Representative James Clyburn and South Carolina Representative Lonnie Hosey. In January, Exhibitions on Piracy on the Carolina Coast and the USS Carolina opened. At the end of June, The Cold War section opened with exhibitions on the Atomic Age, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. The Air Power in South Carolina section is slated to open by the end of August 2024.

The Museum’s “Within the Line of Sight” Lunch & Learn program hosted three speakers, with a focus on the Civil Rights Movement, in April, May and June.

The Museum participated in a variety of community-based events, including the STEMseed Festival (Aiken), SC Archaeology Society’s Fall Field Day (Cayce), Liberty Live (Camden), and Kinetic Derby Day (West Columbia). In December 2023, the Museum partnered with the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve and the Blue Knights Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club for the 6th consecutive year to host the state’s largest “Toys for Tots” charity drive with over 1,000 riders participating in the event.

South Carolina Youth ChalleNGe Academy

The South Carolina Youth ChalleNGe Academy (SCYCA) is a community-based, quasi-military structured educational program that operates the Youth Challenge and Job Challenge Programs. SCYCA’s mission is to empower and prepare youth to develop personal, academic and career success through education, mentoring and training.

The Youth ChalleNGe Program serves youths aged 16-18 and offers two cycles annually in January and July, with the capacity to accommodate up to 150 youths per cycle. During the 22-week residential program, cadets complete a minimum of 40 community service hours and receive various recognitions, training, certifications and licenses to include Honor Society, Public Speaking, Servsafe certification and Forklift Operation certification. During Fiscal Year 2023-2024, the Youth ChalleNGe Program successfully graduated 130 cadets from the program with 61 earning their GED, 18 participated in credit recovery and returned to public high school, and 8 being awarded their High School diploma. Since its establishment in 1998, the Program has graduated 5,241 cadets, 1,968 of whom earned their GED.

After graduation from the Youth ChalleNGe Program, cadets have the opportunity to become associates and attend the Job ChalleNGe Program which provides hands-on job skills training through trade courses beginning in January and August of each year. The Program partners with Midlands Technical College and Southeastern Esthetics Institution to offer the associates a wide range of job market opportunities from trade skills to college credit hours. During this past Year, the Job ChalleNGe Program graduated 31 associates who earned certifications in Welding, HVAC, IT or Medical Assistance. In addition, two associates received their certifications from Southeastern Esthetics Institute. Since its launch in 2016, the Program graduated 338 associates who have completed college credit hours or skills training in areas such as HVAC, Welding, Construction, IT and Medical Administrative Assistance.

STARBASE Swamp Fox

STARBASE Swamp Fox is a Department of Defense funded educational program located at McEntire Joint National Guard Base. The Program focuses on 5th grade students and is designed to generate interest in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM). Students participate in a 25-hour curriculum of hands-on STEM activities and experiences that align with South Carolina State educational standards. STARBASE instructors collaborate with military volunteers to relate the principles students learn in the classroom to real-world application. Students tour different facilities and participate in presentations by members of the SC Air and Army National Guards on their STEM integrated careers. The goal is to excite students about STEM and the possibility of pursuing a STEM based career.

Since its inception in 2003, STARBASE Swamp Fox provided educational enrichment for 19,568 students. The 2023-2024 school year was challenged due to increased transportation costs and reduced bus driver availability in the participating school districts which resulted in several short notice cancellations. In spite of these cancellations, during 2023-2024 school year the Program served 507 students with 11 schools participating from four local school districts. In addition, in June the Program hosted its annual STARBASE Summer Camp for SC Military Department and SC National Guard dependents with its Phase II Summer Camp scheduled for end of July. The Program currently has over 900 students scheduled for the 2024-2025 school year.

South Carolina Army National Guard

The South Carolina Army National Guard (SCARNG) mission is to generate mission-ready units able to fulfill both its Federal and State missions. Specifically, its three main competencies are emergency preparedness/homeland defense, quality Soldier and Family support systems, and innovative technological application. The SCARNG's goal is to ensure relevance through the adaptation of its force structure to meet the challenges of the 21st century.

Approximately 9% of the SCARNG was engaged worldwide in four countries, including Djibouti and Kosovo. The SCARNG's focus of deployments over the last year centered on supporting AFRICOM at Camp Lemmonier, Djibouti. Elements from the 218th MEB, including the 111th Signal Company, the Headquarters Support Company, and the 1782nd Engineer Company, deployed in support of the AFRICOM command element. Later in the year, elements of the Operational Support Airlift Activity Detachment of the 2nd Battalion, 641st Aviation Regiment, deployed to provide fixed-wing aviation transport support to AFRICOM. In total, 431 South Carolina Soldiers supported the area of operations in Africa.

Additionally, the SCARNG supported ongoing operations at the Southwest US Border by sending 125 Soldiers from the 1223rd Engineer Company, and also provided 80 Soldiers for air defense support to the National Capital Region, the U.S. Army European Command.

The SCARNG was also involved in various CONUS-based missions, such as supporting the 101st Airborne Division's WARFIGHTER Exercise at Camp Atteberry, IN, Opposition Force at the National Training Center, Ft. Irwin, CA, and Observer Controller/Trainer duties at the Joint Readiness Training Center, Ft. Johnson, LA.

On 30 August, the South Carolina National Guard activated two truck companies for an EMAC request to support the State of Florida’s Hurricane Idalie response. The request was deactivated prior to the unit’s deployment. MG McCarty redirected these assets to support Horry, Charleston and Beaufort Counties.

During the past FY, the SCNG Counterdrug Task Force, in support of local, State and Federal law enforcement agencies, assisted with seizures of drugs estimated at \$21,085,416.63, \$3,571,543.77 in currency and 79 firearms resulted in civilian law enforcement making 222 arrests. The Task Force hosted law enforcement support classes for approximately 326 law enforcement officers, counterdrug members and coalition members, saving participating agencies roughly \$124,600.00. The Drug Demand Reduction Outreach program (DDRO) also supported 130 events with 275 man-hours of support. After 12 years of non-funding, the Counterdrug Aviation Program was reinitiated as of May 2023 and conducted 3.6 hours of aerial observation supporting 1 agency and 16.5 hours supporting the State Marijuana Eradication Program.

The South Carolina Helicopter Aquatic Rescue Team (SC HART) is a collaborative effort between the State Urban Search and Rescue Task Force (SC-TF1), SCEMD, and SCARNG aviation units. Its capabilities include land—and water-based hoist operations with military aircrews and civilian rescue technicians. The team regularly trains to keep its certifications current and remains ready to deploy at a moment’s notice.

The 43rd Civil Support Team (CST) provided Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Explosive (CBRNE) support to over 19 local, State, and Federal agencies. The CST supported the United States Secret Service, Federal Bureau of Investigations, South Carolina Law Enforcement Division, U.S. Air Force, and several local enforcement agencies. Each of these partnerships allowed the CST to bring value to the Military Department of South Carolina by supporting local communities throughout the state. The missions included over 4,500 hazard sweeps at collegiate stadiums, State VIP visit venues, and other essential state events. The 43rd CST conducted 63 planned, or “Steady State” missions during this FY. The CST regularly advised the SC Emergency Management Division on related topics and situations where exclusive CBRNE expertise was needed.

South Carolina Air National Guard

The South Carolina Air National Guard (SCANG) trains and operates out of the 2,400+ acre McEntire Joint National Guard Base (JNGB) in Eastover, SC which has been the home of the SCANG since its founding in 1946.

The 169th Fighter Wing is the SCANG’s primary formation. The 169th Fighter Wing is the U.S. Air Force’s premier fighter wing and provides Combatant Commanders with world-class combat capability to meet the nation’s needs for contingency and general war requirements. The Wing’s Federal mission is accomplished by employing conventional munitions in the Destruction/Suppression of Enemy Air Defenses (DEAD/SEAD). The 169th Fighter Wing provides continual support of the Aerospace Control Alert Mission, defending east coast air space in support of North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD). Additionally, the Wing provides the Governor with defense assistance to the State’s homeland security office, and disaster preparation and response support for Defense Support to Civilian Authorities (DSCA) activities. The Wing continues to support SC’s State Partner, the Republic of Colombia, with interactions in Colombia and supporting operations in the U.S.

This year the Wing operated the U.S. Air Force’s first deployment of the Expeditionary Air Base Wing in history. 130 Wing personnel took on leadership positions and crucial support functions at location in the Middle East. In addition, SCANG personnel deployed across the Pacific Theater of operations in support of two multi-national exercises. The Wing hosted Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps teams from around the State for the “Top Gun” Drill Meet competition which welcomed over 300 cadets to McEntire JNGB.

The SCANG continues to update and modernize its facilities. Construction continues on taxiways and ramps around the Base to ensure it meets the criteria for future missions like the F35. Additional construction is taking place for a new simulator building to assist in training to meet emerging threats. The SCANG is currently executing \$43M in construction projects on McEntire JNGB with an additional \$28M in projects in the contracting process. Over the next 10 years plans include over \$170M in upgrades to McEntire JNGB facilities.

South Carolina State Guard

During FY 2023-2024, the SC State Guard (SCSG) provided ancillary security assistance for the Cooper River Bridge Run in Mt. Pleasant and Charleston. The SCSG also conducted Honor Guard missions in Newberry and Dillon counties. The SCSG held a Leaders Call with leaders from all levels of the organization to include the Adjutant General and Deputy Adjutant General. This meeting was conducted to assist with unity of purpose, organizational direction, and information dissemination. Additionally, the SCSG participated in Wreaths Across America event at Fort Jackson National Cemetery.

Cyber Initiatives

In FY24, the SCARNG welcomed home the 125th Cyber Protection Battalion (CPB) from a 400-day CONUS mobilization. Upon returning, the unit has leveraged relationships with the SCARNG Defensive Cyberspace Operations Element (DCOE) and the State Guard for various training efforts. Training primarily focused on state incident response familiarization and included relevant topics such as Industrial Control Systems Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (ICS SCADA). Although the primary mission for the 125th CPB in FY24 was to focus on Army-based schools (PME/NCOES/OES/etc.) post-mobilization, the soldiers of the 125th CPB went above and beyond to compete in numerous cyber exercises such as Charleston Cyber Red Zone, Charleston Cyber Blue Zone, the 11th Annual Palmetto Cyber Defense Competition, and Cyber Dawn.

Beginning in FY25, the SCARNG will stand up a new Cyber element known as a Cyber Protection Team Mission Element (CPT-ME). Collaboration between the 125th CPB, DCOE, and the CPT-ME will enable the SCARNG to further advance their cyber capabilities in response efforts and partnerships within the community.

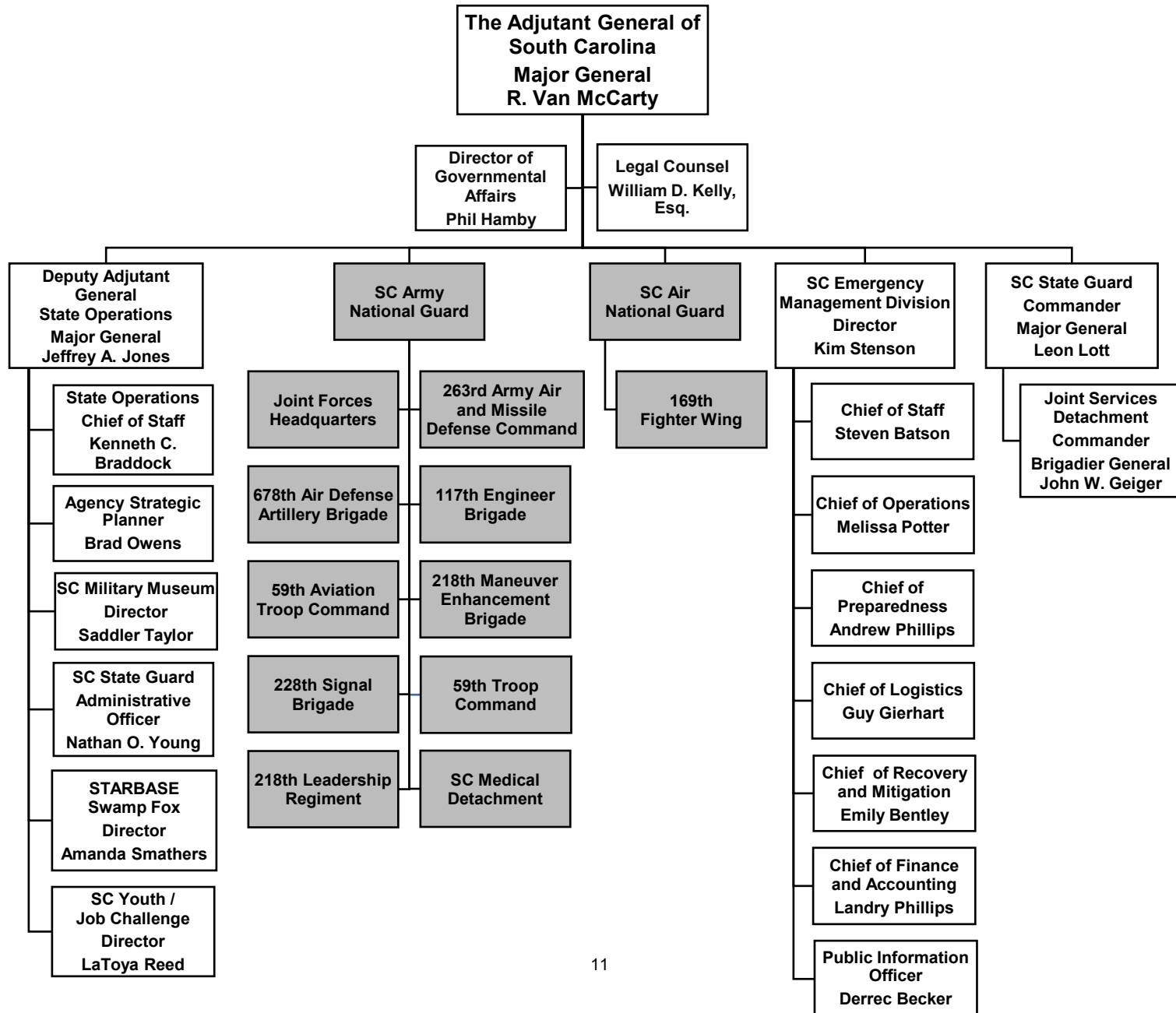
The Agency is in the process of constructing the SC Cyber Integration Center in Aiken, SC in conjunction with the University of SC Aiken. This will include Cyber and Electromagnetic Activities (CEMA), Electronic Security (ES), and Electronic Warfare (EW) ranges at the Savannah River Site.

State Partnership Program between the Republic of Colombia and South Carolina

FY24 marks the 12th Anniversary of the South Carolina National Guard’s active State Partnership Program (SPP) with the Republic of Colombia. Throughout the year the Program promoted unique opportunities for South Carolinians to collaborate with, learn from, and mentor partners from Colombia, executing about 40 mutually beneficial engagements for the third year in a row. In February, The Adjutant General hosted the Colombian Chief of Defense, General Helder Giraldo Bonilla, as well as a team of who Colombian Soldiers participated in South Carolina’s Best Warrior competition for the first time.

Additional SPP events included support for the U.S. Navy’s Continuing Promise medical mission in Cartagena and U.S. Southern Command’s donation of a modular bridge to enhance humanitarian assistance and disaster response in the more remote corners of Colombia. The SCNG executed the emergency delivery of helicopter buckets to assist with the suppression of Colombian wildfires and conducted multiple face-to-face Subject Matter Expert exchanges and military exercises focused on Women Peace and Security, ground vehicle and rotary wing maintenance, cyber security, engineering, artillery and more. The SPP consistently yields meaningful returns on investment, increases readiness for both partners and continuously deepens the security cooperation relationship between the SCNG and the Colombian Military.

NGB's goal is to award each state a military construction project every 5 years, but the timeline is currently unattainable due to MILCON funding. Due to current economic climate in the United States, projects costs are coming back 35% higher than the originally approved budgets which will result in funded projects being pushed to the right. This will lengthen the amount of time before states will receive funding for new military projects.
