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

AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The South Carolina Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office (RFA) was formed under the 2014 Restructuring Act and is governed by three appointed members of the Board of Economic Advisors (BEA). Under S.C. Code of Laws §11-9-1110, the BEA is composed of one member appointed by the Governor to serve as chairman, one member appointed by the chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, one member appointed by the chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee, and the Director of the Department of Revenue who serves ex officio with no voting rights.

RFA is responsible for providing diverse sets of fiscal and statistical analyses, reports, and maps, and managing critical projects that support essential services for the state. Customers of the agency include the Governor, General Assembly, state and local governmental entities, the private sector, and the citizens of the state. The agency has a staff of approximately seventy comprised of analysts, statisticians, epidemiologists, economists, database administrators, web developers, geographic information system (GIS) analysts, surveyors, and project and program managers.

Summary

The goals in our Accountability Report align with those in the strategic plan and center on customer focus, strategic planning, information security, continuous improvement, and workforce development. Leadership developed nine strategies to help achieve our goals and fifteen measures to evaluate our success. We met or exceeded fourteen of the fifteen performance measures with one measure falling slightly below the goal.

The agency identified and accomplished many other projects, not included in the Accountability Report, that support our vision of being a leader in public service. These accomplishments included collaborative efforts with other state agencies and partners, new or improved analysis to facilitate informed decision-making, and other initiatives described below.

Fiscal Year 2023-24 Highlights

Customer Focus

In Fiscal Year 2023-24, RFA released the Education Funding Dashboard and presented the dashboard with the Governor's Office for local media. The Education Funding Dashboard summarizes funding and expenditures for K-12 education to inform the public and provide transparency on school district finances in South Carolina. Additionally, presented the Education Funding Dashboard to the SC School Boards Association and other organizations as requested.

A new tracking system, 911 Logix, was implemented for 911 calls on the statewide system (SC ESInet) which supports a wider range of call reporting capabilities and enhances call monitoring through a more accurate, real-time call tracking dashboard.

Targeted to the public and government users, RFA staff created an interactive web application utilizing aerial imagery to illustrate the impact and reach of the Next Gen 9-1-1 network. The web application will be updated as additional PSAPs are transitioned to the network.

RFA was invited by US Digital Response, a non-profit, non-partisan consulting group, to participate in a Federal Integrated Data System designed to improve the use of integrated data systems.

RFA presented the research capabilities and security/privacy standards of the SC Integrated Data System (IDS), which is leveraged by researchers and other professionals in grant applications and other funding opportunities, to:

- 2023 South Carolina Information Technology Directors Association Fall Conference
- Clemson University School of Health Research
- SC Department of Public Safety

A staff authored a chapter in the collective work, *Early Childhood Research for Educational Equity: Family-School-Systems Connections,* entitled "People, Process, and Policy: Data Integration for System Change", which discussed using integrated data to examine childhood outcomes.

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The SC Integrated Data System was featured on the website for the Public Health Informatics Institute (a non-profit affiliated with Emory University) as an example of fostering collaboration by state agencies to measure and improve mental health activities. South Carolina was one of three states featured based on the use of child and adolescent mental health indicators including school readiness, school attendance, and school disciplinary actions.

Continuous Improvement

In support of Executive Order 2022-03 and to gain a more stable data center, relocated the agency's IT infrastructure to the Department of Administration's State data center and upgraded all virtual servers to new hardware. This upgrade will allow the agency to establish a new backup repository that will provide the resources necessary for an additional ransomware-resistant immutable backup repository.

Population projections were updated for the state and counties to include the most recent estimates from the Population Division of the US Census Bureau. The updated methodology for estimating births and deaths improves the accuracy of current and future trends.

Workforce Development

RFA hosted American Red Cross training for employees for Adult First Aid/CPR/AED-BL and Life-Threatening Bleeding and Tourniquet Application; eleven staff received Red Cross certifications.


Continuing education training credits were provided by presenting an economic and tax update on major South Carolina fiscal issues to the South Carolina Association of Certified Public Accountants.

The Strategic Planning Committee reviewed and updated the three-year budget to align resources with the achievement of the long-term strategic plan and employee compensation strategy.

Staff are kept apprised of our goals and accomplishments throughout the year through our intranet site and correspondence from the Executive Director.
