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AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The University of South Carolina Union provides a high-quality, competitive higher education that will enable students to thrive in a global, diverse, and constantly changing environment. By providing a varied curriculum, grounded in the Liberal Arts, USC Union emphasizes a close working relationship among students, faculty, staff, and the community that promotes self-reliance, freedom of thought and expression, productive citizenship, and critical thinking. Students at USC Union can obtain an Associate of Arts and an Associate of Science, in addition to having access to the baccalaureate degrees available through Palmetto College, the BSN program in partnership with USC Aiken, and transfer pathways in early childhood, elementary, and middle-level education with USC Upstate.

Strategic Priority 1: Attract, inspire, challenge, and enable our students to become innovative thinkers and transformative leaders. This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Attract and retain a highly qualified, appropriately sized and diverse student body at all levels.
2. Provide the highest quality of rigorous instruction and student-centric educational experience to all students.
3. Create innovative, transformative and collaborative lifelong learners.

The USC Union campus has prioritized enhancing student enrollment and retention. In Fall 2023, the number of enrolled students rose significantly to 1,354 from 1,072 the previous fall semester. Enrollment for Spring 2024 slightly decreased to 1,244, yet this still marked a notable increase compared to 984 in the previous spring term. This increase can be attributed to an increase in traditional new freshman and Gray Collegiate Academy becoming a new site of USC Union, enabling us to offer full associate degrees to these students. Enrollment for Fall 2024 is projected to increase due to several ongoing efforts, including expansions of continuing dual enrollment partnerships, enhanced retention efforts aimed at increasing returning students, and the ongoing early college programs with Union County High School and Clinton High School. Additionally, the relocation of our Laurens location to Clinton, SC will support our efforts. The collaboration with USC Aiken to provide the BSN degree on the Union campus also contributes to our growth in enrollment. Under this program, students fulfill their pre-nursing prerequisites at USC Union, positioning them to submit a strong application for the upper division program. By remaining at Union, students can complete the final two years of their degree, carry out their clinical rotations locally, and even pursue employment within our service area if they prefer. Further, we have established a new transfer pathway for early childhood, elementary, and middle-level education with USC Upstate. This partnership offers undergraduates interested in majoring in early childhood, elementary, or middle-level education a clear pathway to earn their associate degree while fulfilling all the prerequisite coursework needed to transfer directly to USC Upstate and complete their last two years of coursework for their bachelor’s degree in one of these three fields. Upon earning their associate degree, students can seamlessly transfer to USC Upstate and enroll directly in upper-level education courses. This program is open to both dually enrolled students, who can earn their associate degree upon high school graduation, and regularly enrolled USC Union students. Through this program, we also aim to address teacher shortages in Union County, as our students who enrolled in the College of Education at USC Upstate have the option to complete their student teaching in Union County Schools. We are also establishing transfer pathways with the College of Hospitality, Retail, and Sport Management at USC Columbia to offer undergraduates interested in majoring in hospitality management, retailing with a concentration in retail management, retailing with a concentration in fashion merchandising and digital innovation, services management, tourism management, or sport and

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entertainment management a clear pathway to earn their associate degree while fulfilling prerequisite requirements needed to transfer for their bachelor’s degree in one of these six fields. Upon earning their associate degree, students can seamlessly transfer to USC Columbia and enroll in the College of Hospitality, Retail, and Sport Management to complete their bachelor’s degree. These efforts, combined with our ongoing initiatives, aim to enhance student enrollment, retention, and success on the USC Union campus.

To achieve our strategic priorities, USC Union has implemented several measures, including study abroad opportunities and global learning initiatives, support through the Student Academic Success Center, promotion of Graduation with Leadership Distinction, funding for undergraduate research, and enriching student life with NJCAA athletics, club sports, and tuition assistance. Students from USC Union have explored educational journeys in Costa Rica, Ireland, France, Spain, and Guatemala. Recently, three USC Union students and two USC Lancaster students participated in a summer study program in England as part of their ENGL 285 course, visiting literary sites like William Wordsworth's home in Cumbria, the Bronte sisters' home in Haworth, Shakespeare's home in Stratford Upon Avon, The Globe theater in London, and Westminster Abbey's Poet's Corner. They also explored cultural landmarks such as Yorkminster Cathedral, the Roman Baths in Bath, and the Tower of London. To further global learning, USC Union hosted the annual Latin American Film Festival during Hispanic Heritage month, showcasing five films and presenting them from an interdisciplinary perspective. This initiative engaged at least thirty-four students, faculty, and staff in screenings and discussions. Inside the classroom, faculty like Gale Ashmore use innovative methods such as the TalkAbroad Program to immerse students in language learning through conversations with native speakers, enhancing language skills and cultural awareness. These efforts aim to broaden students' academic horizons and deepen their understanding of global perspectives.

There has been a focused effort to enhance the impact of the Student Academic Success Center on campus. The Center remains committed to fostering connections with students and the community, organizing events, and offering tutoring services. The Center aims to enrich students' educational journeys through a variety of campus events, including academic workshops and career-oriented programs. This year, the Center hosted seven workshops covering topics such as academic skills, mental health, and technological support, attracting a total of 119 attendees. These workshops, led by faculty members, aim to foster greater engagement between faculty and students beyond the classroom. Additionally, the Center organized a Welcome Back Week in the spring with 160 participants, a Finals Fest in the spring with 263 participants, and another Finals Fest in the fall with 110 participants. These initiatives collectively strive to enhance the overall educational experience for students at USC Union.

USC Union actively supports students striving to achieve Graduation with Leadership Distinction (GLD), enriching their educational journeys by bridging classroom learning with real-world experiences. Through fulfilling GLD requirements, students integrate academic knowledge with practical skills, gaining a deeper appreciation for their education. Presentations and e-portfolios are pivotal components of the GLD program, allowing students to showcase their achievements and reflections to prospective employers. This academic year, three students earned this distinction, with ongoing efforts to raise program awareness through targeted marketing strategies. Looking ahead, we aim to establish a career corner in the Student Academic Success Center, strengthen local service partnerships, and enhance research mentorship initiatives. Additionally, faculty enhance the educational experience by integrating hands-on learning opportunities into their courses. For example, pre-nursing

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students participate in practical exercises in nursing skills labs. UNIV 101 students engage with the community through fundraising activities for important causes. EDPY 401 students gain clinical experience with our local school district. Through our partnership with the South Carolina Afterschool Alliance, students contribute directly to local afterschool programs, fostering practical skills and making a positive impact on the community. These hands-on opportunities provide students with valuable practical skills and the chance to make a positive impact in their community.

USC Union is committed to fostering undergraduate research opportunities and provides annual summer research funding to deserving students and faculty members. In the current year, six students were awarded Palmetto Undergraduate Research Experience (PURE) grants, enabling them to explore diverse research areas and present their research at academic conferences. Fulfilling the grant requirements, last year's recipients (4 students) presented their research at USC's Discover USC. Additionally, one student also presented their research at the annual Southeastern Psychological Association's conference in Orlando, FL, and two students presented research at the International Conference on Humanities, Social and Education Sciences in San Francisco, CA. By offering students the opportunity to engage in undergraduate research, USC Union contributes to the advancement of knowledge in various fields.

USC is fully committed to expanding and strengthening our athletics program while providing unwavering support to our student-athletes. Our athletics program encompasses a range of sports, including men's soccer, baseball, softball, golf, and women's volleyball, all competing at the NJCAA level. Additionally, we offer club-level teams: bass fishing, e-sports, and a rifle team. Looking ahead, we plan to offer women's soccer and cross country. USC Union places significant emphasis on fostering excellence both on and off the field. In the current year, our student-athletes have demonstrated remarkable dedication to academic success, as reflected in their team GPAs. The softball team achieved an outstanding GPA of 3.663, while soccer recorded a commendable 3.334. The baseball team maintained a solid GPA of 3.149, and volleyball exhibited a strong GPA of 3.016. In terms of club-level sports, the bass fishing team achieved a team GPA of 3.132, men's golf earned a team GPA of 2.973, and the rifle team earned a team GPA of 3.843. These impressive team GPAs showcase the campus's dedication to fostering academic excellence and prioritizing the success of our student-athletes in their educational pursuits. Our student-athletes and teams have garnered well-deserved recognition for their athletic achievements. The softball team will be acknowledged as a top 15 NJCAA softball all-academic team, with several players named to the Region 10 and NJCAA All-Academic 1st and 2nd team players. The bass fishing team ranks 23rd out of 600+ schools. Tanner Hadden and Caleb Hudson from the bass fishing team were awarded Anglers of the Year for the Lunkers Trail Division of College Bassmaster. They are one of four teams competing in the College Bracket for a spot in the Bassmaster Classic World Championship and have also qualified for the 2024 National Championship. The men's soccer team achieved their most successful season in school history, with students recognized as Region 10 Player of the Year, Third Team National All-Americans, and Region 10 1st and 2nd team players. Academically, several soccer players were named NJCAA All-Academic First, Second, and Third Team players. The baseball team set a school record for wins, with two students earning the Golden Glove and two students named Region 10 2nd team players. Academically, several students were recognized as NJCAA All-American First, Second, and Third Team Players. One student was named Region 10 2nd team player for volleyball. The golf team consistently finished in the top 4 in all club matches. The rifle team members excelled in various competitions, notably achieving 2nd place in the SC Junior Olympics and 2nd and 3rd place in the Ole Mill Range Monthly Match. These achievements underscore the exceptional talent and dedication of our student-athletes and their significant contributions to our athletic

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program's success. Beyond the field, our student-athletes actively engage in community service. They serve as buddies for the Miracle League, offering support and companionship to individuals with disabilities. They also participate in the Union County Christmas Parade and volunteer their time as coaches and referees at the YMCA, contributing to the development and well-being of young athletes. Through their participation in these community initiatives, our student-athletes demonstrate their commitment to serving others and serve as positive role models in our community.

The support USC Union receives from Union County and Laurens County is invaluable and plays a significant role in the expansion of our student body. Specifically, this support manifests in the form of scholarships. Union County offers scholarships that cover tuition and fees for in-county high school graduates who have achieved a minimum GPA of 3.0. Similarly, Laurens County has a parallel program that provides scholarships for in-county high school graduates with a minimum GPA of 2.0. These scholarship programs not only foster educational opportunities for local students but also contribute to the overall growth and diversity of our student population.

In addition to prioritizing enrollment growth, USC Union has undertaken significant endeavors to enhance student retention and success rates. The undergraduate retention rates for USC Union in previous years were as follows: 26% from Fall 2014 to Fall 2015, 26.4% from Fall 2015 to Fall 2016, 37.8% from Fall 2016 to Fall 2017, 41.3% from Fall 2017 to Fall 2018, 48.9% from Fall 2018 to Fall 2019, 50.7% from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020, 47.7% from Fall 2020 to Fall 2021, and 56.5% from Fall 2021 to Fall 2022. In terms of success, the latest cohort (2019 entering full-time students, captured at 150% completion time) achieved a success rate of 70.8%. This marks a slight decrease from the 2018 cohort (73.3%), but still represents a significant increase from the 2017 cohort's rate of 57.5%. We attribute this positive trend to the range of services and support mentioned earlier, as well as the return to normalcy following the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. To further bolster these rates, the campus has two committees dedicated to retention and success efforts. The first committee is the Academic Intervention Committee, which aims to provide early intervention across campus units to support students who are facing academic challenges. This proactive approach ensures that students in poor academic standing have access to the necessary resources to succeed academically. The second committee, known as the Student Care and Outreach Team (CARE Team), consists of faculty and staff members who offer individual attention and resources to students of concern, including those exhibiting self-injurious or erratic behaviors. These committees play a vital role in fostering a supportive environment and promoting the retention and success of our students.

Strategic Priority 2: Assemble and cultivate a world-class faculty and staff. This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Recruit and develop diverse faculty members who are excellent instructors and recognized scholars with a breadth of experience.
2. Actively attract, recruit, hire and retain a diverse and highly talented staff.
3. Produce and instill a shared culture of excellence.

On the Union campus, our efforts to expand faculty and academic offerings are pivotal in achieving our goals. In the current year, we have initiated several new faculty searches and have successfully hired four new faculty members for the academic year 2024-2025. These additions include an instructor of mathematics, an instructor of fine arts, a tenure-track assistant professor of sociology, and a tenure-track assistant professor of English. By adding expertise in these areas, we aim to enhance the breadth and

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depth of academic opportunities available to our students. In terms of staff, we have strategically expanded our team by adding several permanent staff (e.g., financial aid counselor, student activities coordinator, budget/finance director, head softball coach, disabilities coordinator, administrative assistant, library technology coordinator, accounts receivable manager) and several temporary staff (e.g., maintenance, administrative specialist, assistant athletic director/club coordinator, budget consultant, office assistant, public information specialist, men’s assistant soccer coach, women’s head soccer coach, rifle team coach, and cross country coach). Through the addition of these new faculty and staff members, we are committed to advancing our educational mission and enriching the educational experience for all students at Union.

Full-time faculty carry a standard teaching load of 12 contact hours per semester. Faculty may also request course reductions to engage in scholarly pursuits throughout the academic year, supported by resources from both the campus and Palmetto College. USC Union provides financial support for faculty travel to conferences nationwide and internationally, fostering expertise and enriching classroom experiences through collaborative research opportunities for students, often supported by grants like the Palmetto Undergraduate Research Experience (PURE). The Research Club and the Access, Opportunity, and Engagement Committee play an important role in fostering collaborations between faculty and students, organizing various events that showcase scholarly pursuits within the campus community. This year a professor gave a presentation on “Women and the Constitution,” a staff member/recent graduate gave a presentation on opportunities in undergraduate research, and we hosted a professor from the University of Akron who discussed the Recognize Education and Learning (REAL) education initiative. Additionally, USC Union hosted two Humphrey Fellows who enriched campus culture with their research and provided students with exposure to diverse cultures. These events promote intellectual engagement and encourage the exchange of ideas among members of the academic community. Faculty development at USC Union is further bolstered by a variety of workshops, webinars, and training sessions offered throughout the year through the Center for Teaching Excellence. These resources are designed to enhance pedagogical skills and provide crucial support for faculty in their teaching endeavors. Additionally, faculty benefit from access to grants from Palmetto College and USC Columbia, which facilitate opportunities for research, professional development, and innovative teaching practices. Recent local initiatives include the introduction of a comprehensive faculty orientation, a newly developed advisor training program, and a workshop focused on technological transitions, particularly the adoption of Blackboard Ultra. These initiatives aim to equip faculty with the tools and knowledge needed to excel in their roles, ensuring they can effectively support student learning and engagement.

Strategic Priority 3: Create new pathways to research excellence in order to become Association of American Universities eligible. This strategic priority is linked to two distinct goals:

1. Promote research excellence and innovation through enhancement of Phase I indicators.
2. Promote research excellence and innovation through enhancement of Phase II indicators.

This strategic priority does not directly relate to our campus since USC Union functions as a regional campus within the broader USC system, offering associate degree programs. As previously stated, our faculty members actively contribute to research excellence by maintaining a consistent level of productivity in their scholarly endeavors, even with substantial teaching and service responsibilities. We collect data on scholarly productivity based on the calendar year. Regarding scholarly productivity, during the previous calendar year (2023), the faculty at USC Union documented their scholarly

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achievements, which encompassed the following: 24 publications, 26 conference presentations, 3 creative works, 10 funded grants, 43 reviews of scholarly work, 10 scholarly editor roles, 5 professional consultations, and 2 media consultations/appearances. Palmetto College and the Union campus maintains its commitment to supporting faculty members in their scholarly pursuits, enhancing their teaching and providing opportunities for students to participate in scholarly activities outside the confines of the conventional classroom. The Union campus will continue to allocate resources (with an expenditure of \$31,696.33 for 2023-2024) to facilitate faculty travel for presenting their research.

Strategic Priority 4: Cultivate a more diverse, equitable and inclusive campus culture where every individual, regardless of background, has the full opportunity to flourish and thrive. This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Improve the relative racial/ethnic and gender representation of our student body, staff and faculty.
2. Ensure that there is equity for all students and staff and faculty members across key measures of success.
3. Create, promote, support and assess a campus culture/climate that embodies our Carolinian Creed and makes every member of our university community feel like they are valued and affirmed.

At the Union campus, our focus revolves around enhancing campus climate and fostering inclusivity. One of our primary endeavors involves finding innovative ways to support the mental well-being of our students, faculty, and staff. Alongside the previously mentioned CARE Team, we are pleased to offer a valuable resource called the Student Assistance Program (SAP), available to all students and their immediate family members. This program covers both our regular and dual enrollment students, regardless of their location—whether on campus, online, or at off-site high schools where we offer dual enrollment programs. SAP provides confidential, short-term counseling and personal consultations, free of charge, to address personal and/or professional concerns. Moreover, it extends work-life resources, including legal and financial consultations, online learning support, and various other resources. To further cater to the mental health needs of our on-campus students, USC Union has contracted with Uwill, which provides immediate access to teletherapy, crisis intervention, and wellness programs through a secure online platform. Students can schedule sessions based on their preferences for therapist availability, issue, gender, language, and ethnicity. Also, in collaboration with the USC Psychological Services Center, USC Union offers telehealth therapy, in-person therapy, and psychological assessments on-campus. These services come at no cost to our students, faculty, or staff, ensuring that mental health support is readily accessible and affordable for everyone within our community. In addition to these services, the campus organizes an annual event called Fresh Check Day, held every September. Fresh Check Day serves as a positive initiative to promote mental health and prevent suicide. The event strives to establish a welcoming and optimistic environment where students feel encouraged to openly discuss mental health topics. It acts as a bridge, connecting students with the various mental health resources accessible on campus, within the community, and on a national level. Fresh Check Day serves as a valuable platform to foster dialogue and increase awareness surrounding mental health issues.

To promote an inclusive campus culture and environment, the Office of Academic and Student Affairs arranges an annual week-long workshop series in November. These workshops cover a range of important topics, including civil rights/Title IX, sexual harassment, suicide prevention, drug and alcohol abuse awareness, and mental health. While student-athletes are mandated to attend these workshops,

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they are open to participation by all students, faculty, and staff. This initiative aims to provide comprehensive education and awareness, ensuring that the entire campus community has access to valuable information and resources related to these critical areas. Next year, the campus will strongly encourage all students to complete a series of online community education modules. These modules encompass four topics: alcohol/drug awareness, sexual assault and prevention, mental health, and inclusivity. In addition to the workshops and community education modules, every two years students are encouraged to participate in the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE). This national survey assesses institutional practices and student behaviors that strongly correlate with student learning and retention, including aspects related to campus culture and climate. By participating in the CCSSE, students contribute valuable feedback that provides the campus with insightful information on student engagement. This data aids in shaping institutional practices and fostering an environment that supports student success and overall well-being. Lastly, in recognition of the achievements of our first-generation college students, we organize an annual celebration day dedicated to honoring their accomplishments. This year, we facilitated an exhibition that connected students with various campus resources, ensuring they had access to the support and assistance they needed. To further commemorate this special occasion, we hosted an exclusive party specifically for our first-generation students, complete with engaging games and exciting prizes. These events are aimed to celebrate the unique journeys of our first-generation college students and provide them with a supportive and celebratory environment.

At the USC Union campus, we have a dedicated Access, Opportunity and Engagement (AOE) committee. This committee is deeply committed to working towards organizing various initiatives, curricula, events, and activities that align with our core values and the principles outlined in the Carolinian Creed. Their objective is to foster a campus environment that promotes inclusive policies, upholds the rights of all individuals, and stands for positive action. The committee actively recommends institutional policies that affirm the rights and dignity of every person, irrespective of any categorization. Through collaborative efforts with student organizations like the African American Alliance and other campus committees and offices, the AOE committee was involved in a series of engaging events this year. These events encompassed a diverse range of activities aimed at fostering inclusivity and celebrating different cultures and perspectives. Among the highlights were a unity lunch, historic discussion panel, gospel music event, movie screenings, mental health workshops, the Latin American Film Festival, and hosting two Humphrey Fellows from Africa. These events provided platforms for dialogue, cultural exchange, and artistic expression, creating opportunities for students to broaden their understanding, connect with one another, and celebrate the richness of diversity on campus.

Strategic Priority 5: Harness the power, attributes and institutional diversity of an integrated and interoperative university system that enhances access, success and affordability for every eligible student S.C. student. This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Develop an internal university system governance structure that establishes high-impact autonomy, service excellence and consistent policies while optimizing performance.
2. Establish an integrated online program management enterprise that maximizes access and affordability for both traditional and nontraditional students in S.C. and beyond.
3. Leverage the university system to provide accelerated, lower-cost multidegree options for students.

USC Union, as a part of Palmetto College, provides accessible and affordable associate degree programs

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to students both within our service area and beyond. Students have the option to complete their first two years of college credit at USC Union, either through in-person or online instruction, and subsequently pursue their bachelor's degree online. The mission of Palmetto College is to ensure that all South Carolinians, regardless of their location, have access to flexible, affordable, and accessible education. In collaboration with USC Columbia and other comprehensive institutions within the USC system, Palmetto College offers a variety of bachelor's degree programs, including majors such as organizational leadership and liberal studies. Additionally, USC Union provides the opportunity for students to pursue a fully online associate degree. This year, we partnered with USC Upstate and Union County School District to offer a direct pathway for students to earn their bachelor's degree in early childhood, elementary, or middle-level education. USC Union is dedicated to delivering high-quality education at an affordable cost. The tuition rate at USC Union for resident students is \$3,579 per semester, which is consistent across all four Palmetto College campuses (Lancaster, Salkehatchie, Sumter). For the four-year degree programs offered through Palmetto College, the tuition rate is \$5,199 per semester for resident students. This rate is lower than that of the nearest senior campus (Upstate - \$5,604, resident status) and the main campus in Columbia (\$6,144, resident status). The four Palmetto College campuses collaborate with university officials to maintain this lower cost, ensuring that students can access affordable education without compromising on quality.

Strategic Priority 6: Spur innovation and economic development through impactful community partnerships. This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Create future opportunities in research, education and scholarship through state, federal and industry partnerships.
2. Be an engine for business development in the state of South Carolina.
3. Expand community partnerships to increase business opportunities, develop new relationships and increase experiential learning.

At USC Union, we focus on enriching the educational experience through strong community partnerships and meaningful student engagement. Our efforts include offering internships through work-study assignments, with this year's GLD internships completed through Columbia or online. We are actively working to establish a formal local internship program. Our students contribute to the community by volunteering with organizations like the Miracle League and local YMCA, speaking at schools, and supporting high school sports teams. Community support for our athletics program is robust, with several organizations sponsoring our teams. We are involved in the Union County Community Remembrance Project, which preserves local racial history and promotes education, justice, and healing. Faculty engage students in learning about the experiences of formerly enslaved people at Rose Hill Plantation. USC Union also serves on the Union County Economic Development Board, striving to attract new industries to the area. Additional partnerships include those with Union County EMS, Lutz Foundation, Union County Arts Council, Dixie Youth Girls/Boys, Preservation SC, and others.

Strategic Priority 7: Provide a sustainable campus infrastructure – physical, virtual, fundraising and administrative – that supports academic excellence and preminent student life. This strategic priority is linked to five distinct goals:

1. Provide a physical campus that support the academic and student life needs of the modern and future university while ensuring the safety of the university community.
2. Provide state-of-the-art virtual infrastructure that supports delivery of academic content and

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facilitates highly competitive research.

3. Grow fundraising and external funding activities to significantly impact and improve the university's capital, scholarship and academic programs.
4. Ensure administrative activity is focused on innovation, preparedness and increasing transparency.
5. Promote a framework for national leadership in institutional sustainability.

To improve accessibility for students enrolled in our degree programs both locally and across Palmetto College, the Union campus has undertaken a series of significant infrastructure enhancements. Recent upgrades include relocating our Laurens location to Clinton, SC, and completing extensive interior improvements in the Whitener Building, such as new carpet, paint, ceiling tiles, remodeled restrooms, and the installation of a variable refrigerant volume system and LED lights. Additional enhancements encompass the creation of a new overflow parking lot, comprehensive interior and exterior renovations at Truluck Gym (including a new roof, exterior painting, updated restrooms, and LED lighting), and improvements at the Jonesville athletic facility, which now features upgraded baseball parking, a new scoreboard, and a flagpole. Ongoing projects include expanding the Rippy Courtyard to provide more outdoor space for students, installing new interior and exterior safety cameras, constructing a new softball facility, upgrading locker rooms and the weight room with ADA-compliant family restrooms at the Jonesville athletic facility, and undertaking renovations in the Main Building. These renovations will include a new variable refrigerant volume system, updated carpet and paint, LED lighting, new student desks and chairs, new offices, and remodeling of the Student Academic Success Center to enhance the overall campus experience. Additionally, the catalog of online course offerings continues to expand to accommodate students who cannot attend classes in person. For students on campus, improvements to existing facilities continue to make for a more enjoyable experience and one that makes it easier to focus on their learning inside and outside of the classroom. Through prudent financial management, USC Union has been able to address deferred maintenance needs, improve the campus environment, and enhance its educational programs, while maintaining a stable financial position. In turn, these expenditures for improvements have aided in the recruitment and retention of students. The balance for FY24 is at \$1,341,000. This is lower than the original projected goal of \$1,734,690. The target was not met due to a revaluation of employee accrued annual leave. The revaluation resulted in a year-end accrual expense entry of \$386,000 initiated by the Controller's Office. The campus will work towards a 3 months of average expenses reserve fund over the next 3 budget years, with an estimated fund balance of \$1,750,000 at the end of FY27.

Strategic Priority 8: Build teams that win with excellence and character. This strategic priority is linked with three distinct goals:

1. NCAA Teams will compete at the upper level of their potential at all times.
2. USC will ensure holistic development of student-athletes, measured by graduation, academic achievement and student-athlete wellness.
3. Create and foster a campus environment that drives a winning attitude while instilling character and integrity in competition and in life.

USC Union actively participates in the National Junior College Athletics Association (NJCAA) for sports like baseball, softball, men's soccer, golf, and women's volleyball. We also engage in intercollegiate marksmanship, club bass fishing, and e-gaming. In the upcoming fall, we are excited to introduce new club teams including cross country and women's soccer. As a campus, we prioritize the

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holistic development of our students and strive for excellence in both their academic and athletic pursuits. To ensure this, we adhere to rigorous student-athlete eligibility standards and comply with the policies governed by the NJCAA. To maintain these standards, we have implemented various practices to support our student-athletes. Academically, we provide mandatory study hall sessions where athletes receive support and guidance to stay on track towards academic success. These study halls are typically held in the Student Academic Success Center, equipped with computer facilities and access to peer-to-peer and professional tutoring services. Student-athletes also receive guidance from advisors within the athletic department who understand the unique challenges and experiences faced by college athletes. These advisors assist in developing academic plans that align with the athletes' goals while considering the demands of their athletic commitments. In addition to NJCAA policies, all coaches establish rules and expectations for student-athletes, fostering their growth and development throughout the year. Student-athletes are expected to adhere to the student code of conduct and other relevant policies outlined in both the USC Union Student Handbook and the Athletic Student Handbook. Coaches conduct end-of-year evaluations to provide feedback on individual performance and offer suggestions for improvement. The dedicated attention and guidance provided to our student-athletes has resulted in numerous athletic awards and consistently high team GPAs (described earlier), reflecting our commitment to their success.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies

USC Union actively participates in the USC Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) Program, which has been established in accordance with the guidance of the International Standards Organization. This program ensures that all forms of risk are managed in a systematic, transparent, and credible manner. Risk assessment is an integral part of our long- and short-term institutional planning process. It is crucial for us to continue providing our services as not doing so would have a negative impact on the statewide objective of enhancing the educational preparedness of South Carolinians. USC Union offers affordable opportunities for high-quality education, particularly benefiting those who are economically disadvantaged within our service area. Failing to achieve our goals would further disadvantage these individuals. Furthermore, our partnership with USC Aiken in delivering their Bachelor of Science in Nursing program at USC Union plays a vital role in providing high-quality nursing care for our region. By training nurses who choose to remain in the area, we contribute to the overall health and well-being of our service area. Failing to accomplish our goals in this regard would have adverse effects on the community's healthcare services. To mitigate the potential negative impacts, it may be necessary for our agency to seek state funding for the general operating funds budget. Additionally, increasing the allocation for dual enrollment tuition for high school students and enhancing the availability of state scholarship funds could help address these challenges. We propose that the General Assembly consider taking the following actions to address these potential issues:

1. Increase the allocation of funds to the general operating budget.
2. Enhance the revenue provided for dual credit students.
3. Increase the availability of state scholarship funds.

By implementing these measures, we can better ensure the continued success and positive impact of USC Union on our community.

The Union regional Palmetto College campus is a branch campus of the University of South Carolina Columbia. Union has as its mission to provide higher education and intellectual leadership, contributing to the primary mission of the University of South Carolina System so stated as “outstanding education, research, creative activity, community engagement, and service that drives community and economic impact or the benefit of the state, nation, and world.” At the heart of this mission is a teaching faculty of high quality dedicated to excellence in instruction, scholarship, public and professional service, and creative endeavor which enrich the classroom experience. The Union regional Palmetto College campus offers a varied curriculum grounded in the liberal arts and focused on preparing students to continue their education in the University of South Carolina System and throughout life.

The Union regional Palmetto College campus recruits students prepared to succeed in completing a baccalaureate- level education. While the institution does not offer remedial instruction, it is nonetheless able to admit most students who apply due to the close working relationship between students and faculty. The original design of the institution incorporated a flexibility that has allowed changes in institutional capability with increasing educational demands of constituents.

Through classroom and laboratory instruction delivered in a variety of face-to-face and distance learning formats and modalities, the institution awards the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees and provides for the completion of selected bachelor’s degrees on campus through cooperative agreements and delivery structures with other University of South Carolina System institutions. The Union regional Palmetto College campus also provides general education and upper division coursework applicable to baccalaureate degree programs offered through colleges and universities nationwide. In addition to academic coursework, the mission of the campus includes noncredit courses, seminars, and workshops made available to the community for cultural enrichment and professional development.

The traditions of cultural diversity and freedom of thought are valued at the Union regional Palmetto College campus. In a learning environment that develops respect for racial, geographical, intellectual, and economic diversity and an awareness of individual, societal, and global responsibilities, Union promotes courses, activities, and attitudes that instill in students a thirst to continue learning throughout life.

The Union regional Palmetto College campus emphasizes the development of the whole person and especially seeks to foster in students the disciplines essential to an educated citizenry. Core competencies, including the ability to communicate through effective writing and articulate speech; computational and quantitative mastery; creative and critical thinking; and the duties of citizenship are strategically integrated within the curriculum. Classroom experiences, student activities, and physical education programs also provide opportunities for cultural enrichment, leadership development, intellectual growth and interpersonal relationships, all contributing to a sense of self-reliance and a joy of learning.
