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AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Background

The Department of Public Health (DPH) was established effective July 1, 2024, pursuant to Act 60 of 2023 (DHEC Restructuring). This Act created two new cabinet agencies from the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC). With this Act, all health-related activities were transferred to the new Department of Public Health, all environmental activities were transferred to the new Department of Environmental Services (see notes in Legal portion), and all food regulation activities were transferred to the existing Department of Agriculture.

DPH is responsible for providing services through the following core divisions:

- **Health Promotion and Services (HPS):** Promotes community health and well-being by protecting people from disease, illness and injury, as well as providing access to quality care.
- **Healthcare Quality (HQ):** Enhances patient safety and the quality of care by leading efforts to make healthcare in South Carolina safer, more accessible, affordable, equitable, and of higher quality.

In addition, **Administration** provides the Department’s program areas with the necessary support to ensure the successful accomplishment of our mission and vision. These teams include health strategy and external affairs, general counsel, information technology, human resources, and finance and operations.

DPH has locations in central office (Columbia-area) and approximately 100 locations across the state, with nearly 2,900 employees providing critical services to the people of South Carolina.

Agency Successes

A significant and notable success for DPH is the sunset of DHEC and successful creation and launch of DPH on July 1, 2024. The Department of Administration led the overall implementation of Act 60. To prepare for the new agency, DPH staff created DPH’s brand using internal resources, developed a DPH website, established and requested a budget, assigned administration staff and related funding to the new agency, and split and duplicated IT applications, servers, network, and functions. Act 60 implementation was completed successfully while DPH continued to provide high-quality services to its customers.

While DPH did not exist prior to July 1, 2024, the health areas of DHEC achieved many accomplishments in FY24. DPH will continue building on these successes as a new agency while also making changes to improve the health of every South Carolinian. Highlights include:

- Soliciting and using customer feedback to inform and implement improvements,
- Implementing an Electronic Health Record (EHR) system,
- Increasing the number of HIV clients linked to care,
- Increasing the percentage of infant WIC participants who are breastfed,
- Identifying and prioritizing critical upgrades to current financial systems, and
- Increasing graduation rates of internal and external leadership programs.

Significant Projects

Since DPH is newly created, reporting on significant projects is limited for this period. However, the agency remains committed to continuously evaluating, developing, and implementing best practices and standards to achieve the desired outcomes set forth in DPH’s strategic plan.

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Strategic Plan

The agency is currently developing a strategic plan that will guide and strengthen the DPH's infrastructure and service delivery. The following elements of the strategic plan have been established, communicated, and implemented, with input from staff and leadership:

- **Mission:** To protect, promote, and improve the health and well-being of everyone in South Carolina.
- **Vision:** Healthy people living in healthy communities
- **Core Values:**
 - ***Embracing Service:*** We embrace our responsibility to reliably serve our communities, customers, and each other in a respectful manner, relying upon clear and uncompromised commitments to integrity, trust, dependability, and responsiveness.
 - ***Inspiring Innovation:*** We encourage and empower our teams to find creative, science- and data-driven solutions to promote, protect, and improve the health of the public.
 - ***Promoting Teamwork:*** We cultivate inclusive and collaborative teams that value the diverse thoughts, experiences, and expertise of every team member, our stakeholders, and our communities.
 - ***Pursuing Excellence:*** We are steadfast in our commitment to the highest achievable standards of quality and professionalism.
 - ***Advancing Equity:*** We are committed to giving all South Carolinians the opportunity to attain optimal health outcomes by fostering a culture of fairness, equity, and inclusion for everyone.
- **Priority Areas:**

Our priority areas are the high-level themes that will accomplish our mission and vision and encompass the program-level goals of accountability we aim to achieve. These areas identify the fundamental policy questions and critical challenges DPH will prioritize during the next few years.

 - ***Public Health Infrastructure:*** Striving for operational excellence by building and sustaining a diverse and skilled public health workforce, and improving the coordination of systems, processes, and policies with internal and external stakeholders.
 - ***Collaboration & Engagement:*** Strengthening partnerships, aligning statewide efforts and initiatives, and engaging with all sectors and communities to promote trust and transparency.

South Carolina Public Health & Environmental Laboratory

Though the planning for new laboratory facilities began before FY24 as DHEC, the primary responsibility to oversee the project to completion was transferred to DPH. The groundbreaking of the lab occurred in March 2024 and significant continual progress has been made since then. With the implementation of new technology and updated testing systems, the lab will be able to better serve the public through disease

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prevention, control, and surveillance; emergency preparedness and response; environmental health and protection; and public health research, training, and education. The lab is on schedule and expected to be completed by the fall of 2026.

Agency’s Current Efforts and Associated Results

State Health Assessment and State Health Improvement Plan

In FY24, DHEC led the development of the [State Health Assessment \(SHA\)](#) with key support from the Alliance for a Healthier South Carolina and its membership. The SHA is a comprehensive compilation of health-related data outlining health across the lifespan, from maternal and infant health to healthy aging. It highlights our state’s population as a whole, as well as the demographic subpopulations making South Carolina the diverse state it is. The assessment is used to examine key health indicators, identify health disparities and monitor trends and progress in the field of public health. It builds on extensive community engagement and highlights capacity throughout our state, including resources and assets that work collaboratively to improve the health of South Carolina residents.

Throughout the assessment, information is used to identify high-priority issues, develop strategies to address public health concerns, and inform the next iteration of South Carolina’s State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP). The SHIP provides a vision for continuous health improvement and will be a roadmap used by government agencies, community-based organizations, health care professionals, advocates, policy makers, and other stakeholders to take action to leverage resources and focus work on measurable improvement. While DPH is tasked with leading this effort, the SHA and the SHIP are developed with extensive input and collaboration from various organizations, associations, agencies, and communities throughout the state to ensure diverse expertise, experience, and perspectives are included.

Additionally, DPH will use these assessments in its strategic planning. DPH is currently developing the agency’s strategic planning process to include promoting a culture of continuous improvement and building in consistent mechanisms for listening, planning, doing, monitoring, evaluating, and adjusting to make sure the strategic planning efforts continuously align with statewide needs. To do so, DPH is using the SHA and the SHIP as roadmaps to ensure the direction set for the agency aligns with the identified needs and strategic priority areas.

Public Health Infrastructure Grant

In 2022, DHEC was awarded over \$48 million through the Federal Public Health Infrastructure Grant (PHIG). PHIG funding is intended to help meet critical infrastructure needs in the short-term, while also making possible strategic investments that will have lasting effects on public health agencies across the United States. This funding opportunity was designed to improve public health infrastructure so that public health agencies become better positioned to maximize use of future federal funding opportunities, as opposed to strictly building teams/programs that will require future funding. PHIG’s goal is to make permanent changes to strengthen public health infrastructure, workforce, and data systems.

Upcoming Significant Changes

Proviso 118.22 (SR: Bull Street Corridor Relocation)

On Nov. 14, 2023, the Joint Bond Review Committee (JBRC) voted unanimously on Proviso 118.22 of the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Appropriations Act (SR: Bull Street Corridor Relocation) to allow the Department to

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execute a lease on July 1, 2024, to relocate to a new location at 400 Otarre Parkway in Cayce, contingent upon the appropriation of funding from the General Assembly.

On July 3, 2024, Governor McMaster signed H. 5100, the FY 2024-25 General Appropriations Act, which fully funded the move to the Otarre Parkway facility. This move, which is expected to take place early 2025, will relocate nearly 1,200 Columbia-based DPH employees, including employees located at 2100 Bull Street, 2600 Bull Street, 301 Gervais Street, 8301 Parklane Road, and 1777 Saint Julian Place. Some programs will relocate to State Park.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies

If DPH were unable to accomplish its goals and objectives, the most likely negative impacts on the public may be widespread disease outbreak without the necessary resources for response; a significant decline in quality of health care services provided in our state, which could result in injury, illness, or death; and an increase in chronic diseases with an accompanying decrease in overall wellness and health. To mitigate these potential outcomes, DPH will continue sustaining critical relationships with other state agencies, local governments, local and state medical and health organizations, community-based organizations, and federal government entities. In working with the General Assembly to avoid these crises, DPH will work to ensure state laws provide sufficient authority to maintain and improve services and care within DPH’s scope; regularly review and propose amendments to agency regulations to implement best practices and technological advances, and strengthen the regulated community’s operations and functions; and intentionally align budget requests with the stated objectives and measures in the DPH Strategic Plan.

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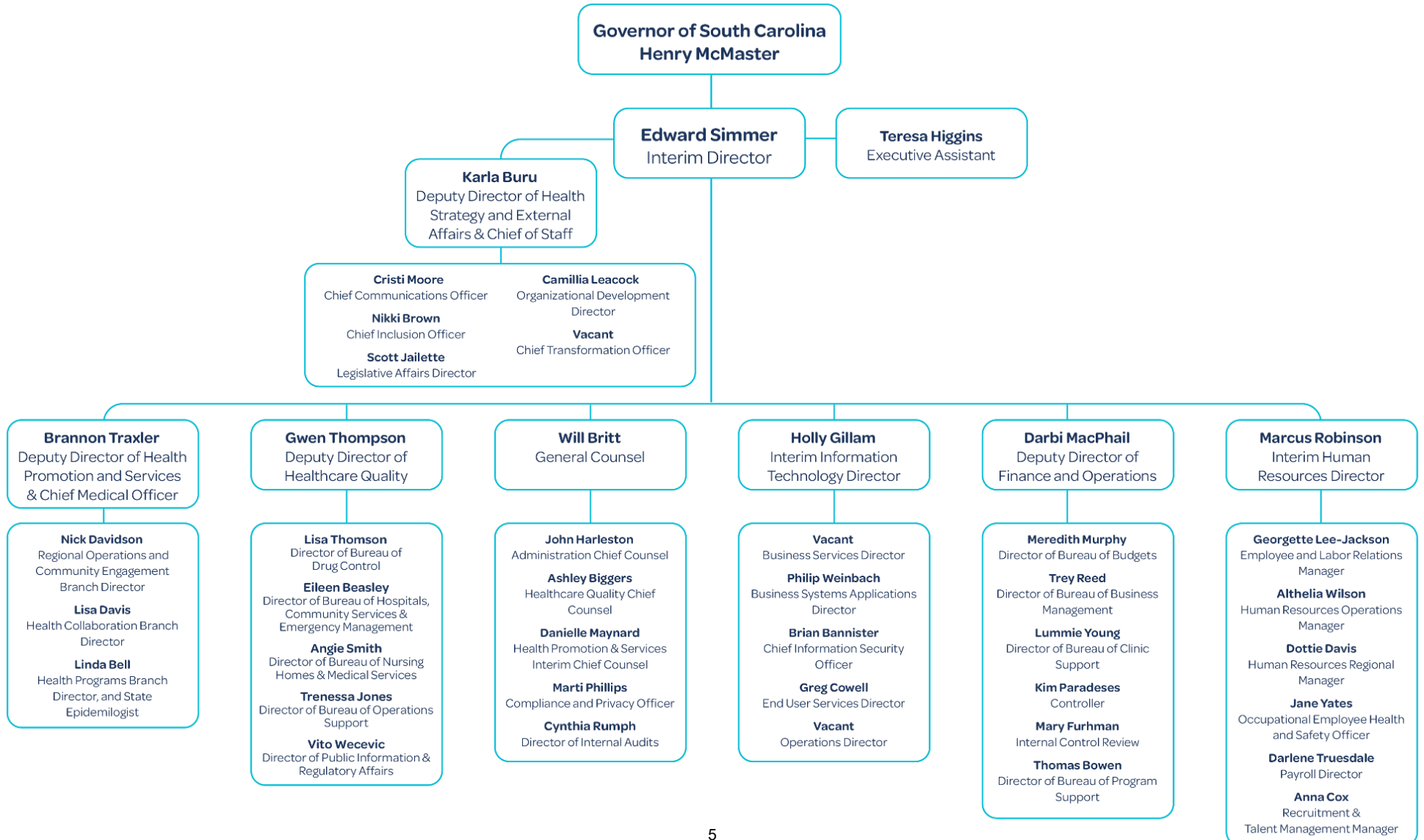
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Department of Public Health (DPH) Organizational Chart
