### SOUTH CAROLINA SEA GRANT CONSORTIUM

The S.C. Sea Grant Consortium generates and provides science-based information on issues and opportunities to improve the social and economic well-being of coastal residents while ensuring the optimal use and conservation of marine and coastal natural resources with the goal of optimizing the balance among economic, social, and environmental potential of the state's coastal and marine resources through the support of integrated research, education, and extension programs. The Consortium addresses the uncertainty that change brings to the coastal region and how we as a state and society can adapt and prosper. ### ORGANIZATION

The Consortium is a nationally certified Sea Grant College Program under the auspices of the National Sea Grant College Program, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and U.S. Department of Commerce. ### STRATEGIC AND IMPLEMENTATION PLANNING

The S.C. Sea Grant Consortium is currently operating under a FY2024-27 Strategic Plan titled "Charting Seas of Change." <u>https://www.scseagrant.org/strategic-plan/</u> The agency's strategic plan has specific performance measures and target metrics for its three strategic administrative and management areas, which include (1) Planning, Program Management, and Overall Performance, (2) Connecting with Users, and (3) Human Resources. In addition, the Consortium has outlined specific vision statements, goals, objectives, strategies, performance measures and metrics for each of the agency's five strategic programmatic focus areas: (1) Healthy Coastal Ecosystems, (2) Sustainable Coastal Development and Economy, (3) Weather and Climate Resilience, (4) Sustainable Fisheries and Aquaculture, and (5) Scientific Literacy and Workforce Development. The Consortium employs a number of stakeholder mechanisms to ensure that program efforts are relevant and timely, including an 18-member Program Advisory Board

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and eight program-specific advisory committees.

### **PERFORMANCE MEASURES AND METRICS**

The Consortium's Strategic Plan includes several dozen performance measures and metrics tracked annually. The Consortium's FY23-24 State Accountability Report is focused on the goals and objectives, and the resultant outputs and outcomes, which make up its three strategic administrative and management areas. Updates on these metrics are presented to the Consortium Board of Directors (at its Board meeting), the State of South Carolina (through the agency's State Accountability Report), and the NOAA National Sea Grant College Program (through formal reporting) on an annual basis.

### IMPACTS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

This year we reported to the NOAA Sea Grant College Program 86 impacts and accomplishments, 50 products, 39 trainings and \$21,712,308 in economic benefits for the state between February 1, 2023-January 31, 2024, our federal reporting period. <u>https://www.scseagrant.org/performance-and-accountability/</u>

These span five themes:

- ° Healthy coastal ecosystems
- ° Sustainable coastal development and economy
- ° Weather and climate resilience
- ° Sustainable fisheries and aquaculture
- ° Scientific literacy and workforce development

### **INFORMATION DELIVERY**

The Consortium has become a primary source of information for coastal and marine information and assistance. This occurs through the interactions of Extension staff with coastal constituents, through communications such as *Coastal Heritage* magazine and through the Consortium's website (www.scseagrant.org). During FY23-24, the Consortium website received approximately 158,000 page views from approximately 72,000 unique visitors, up 55% and 33%, respectively. The Consortium's communications and education specialists continue to produce awardwinning and relevant products and services. The Consortium continued its successful e-news brief called *CoastalScience@Work* to keep key state leaders and decision-makers aware of Consortium programs, activities, and impacts. Additionally, the Consortium delivers a bi-weekly newsletter focused on career and funding opportunities

### **AGENCY STAFFING**

The Consortium holds 23 state FTE positions. In addition, the Consortium currently has two temporary grant positions (time-limited) and three current vacant positions in process at the time of this reporting submission.

### **BUDGET SITUATION AND FUTURE**

The Consortium continues to foster efficiencies in its staffing. The agency has brought in young talent and fresh thinking to fill key staff vacancies and newly created positions, the new staff have complemented the remaining veteran staff, and the Consortium is providing more formal graduate student internship experiences to assist its administrative and professional staff with programming and projects.

This year the agency was successful in receiving two new positions, Coastal Community Engagement Specialist and Marine Education Specialist. Both will engage with the rapidly growing population of residents and visitors along our coast. The agency was also able to obtain two non-funded FTE so that we could move federally funded TGE to FTE due to their long-term funding status. Due to a very successful national review, the Consortium was able to secure an annual federal merit increase of \$173,619 in February 2023 that will provide for increased agency capacity to provide technical assistance, information, and guidance to stakeholders and constituents on the physical processes and dynamics of the South Carolina (and southeastern U.S.) coastal region, and changes thereto, as influenced by natural phenomena, climate and weather, and anthropogenic effects through. Agency leadership recognizes that the state budget will be limited by resource availability, and thus discussions about means by which Consortium support can be sustained, increased, and diversified

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will continue with the Consortium's Board of Directors, Program Advisory Board, and the S.C. General Assembly.

### EXTRAMURAL FUNDING AND THE STATE BUDGET

The Consortium continues to demonstrate its ability to secure competitive extramural funding for its programs, which tempers its need to approach the S.C. General Assembly for state funding. At the federal level, the NOAA National Sea Grant College Program received a FY 2024 appropriation of \$94 million. Of that amount, Congress directed Sea Grant to allocate \$14 million to aquaculture research and outreach. The Consortium has been successful in obtaining additional competitive grant funding from the National Sea Grant Office during this period to support workshops and programmatic activities.

The Consortium continued its recent success securing an additional \$4.44M of extramural support in FY2023-24. Since FY2019-20, the Consortium has secured over \$18.6M in extramural resources; an increase of over 75% compared to the previous five (5) year timeframe.

### **RETURN-ON-INVESTMENT**

The Consortium benefited from additional state recurring funds over the past five years, which enables it to meet the administrative and programmatic needs of the agency and thus address the growing needs of its diverse constituencies. Over the last 10 years, the Consortium has secured over \$29.3 million in non-state competitive funding from a state investment of approximately \$7.5 million; a **387% return** on the state's investment.


### **RISK ASSESSMENT AND MITIGATION STRATEGIES**



The accomplishments and the capacities that the NOAA National Sea Grant College Program brings to the states has been an important factor in continued federal funding and increased service to our businesses, communities, and residents. The agency is building awareness and partnerships among state and national leaders to serve the Consortium's numerous, extremely diverse, and supportive cast of stakeholders, constituents, and communities, including the state's General Assembly and our U.S. Congressional delegation, with whom we partner, serve, and depend on. It is with this support that the National Sea Grant College Program and the Consortium survive financial challenges and sustain positive outcomes.

What the state would lose with the Consortium's demise would be what the National Sea Grant Site Visit team stated: the Consortium is recognized as an intellectual leader within the State; is nimble, flexible, adaptable, and relevant; is recognized as an honest broker of information and assistance for coastal and ocean issues; and recognized for its non-advocacy. The state and its citizens would also lose a significant return on its investment, both in financial and societal terms.
