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#### **AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS**

The ORS continues to serve the public interest of consumers across all programmatic areas. This narrative covers selected highlights from FY 23-24 as well as risk and mitigation strategies for the future.

#### **Cases and Savings for Consumers**

Of the 113 newly docketed cases the ORS participated in during FY 23-24, these rate-impacting cases generated savings to consumers of **\$13,885,603**:

#### **Consumer Services**

The Consumer Services Department is the agency's first line of contact with consumers. Consumer Services supports consumers to arrange installment payments, extensions to payment due dates, manageable security deposits, and access to community financial assistance resources. In FY 23-24, staff members worked with consumers to recover funds due to billing errors, refunds of deposits, unauthorized charges, incorrect rates being charged, disputes about charges, and service-quality issues. As part of its consumer education outreach, Consumer Services distributed **39,000** copies of publications and promotional materials.

In FY 23-24, Consumer Services fielded **1,521** complaints and inquiries from consumers and recovered **\$698,010** on their behalf (approximately \$127,000 of which are annually recurring recoveries).

#### **Broadband**

The fundamental goal of the South Carolina Broadband Office (SCBBO) is to expand broadband access across the state. The conclusion of FY 23-24 saw several major milestones reached. On June 28, 2024, the SCBBO announced the conclusion of its American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant programs that have resulted in the commitment of \$400 million to expand high-speed internet access to over 112,380 unserved or underserved Broadband Serviceable Locations (BSLs) statewide.

The 25-month process was initiated on May 13, 2022, when the Governor signed Act 244 into law, which allocated ARPA funding to a variety of state agencies – including \$400 million to the ORS to expand broadband infrastructure.

Taken collectively, ARPA broadband funds were awarded to 19 Internet Service Providers (ISP) for 129 projects. The funding positively impacted all 46 counties and is currently transforming over 23 Main Street communities – including the final two underserved municipalities of Norway and Ridge Spring, SC. When complete, ARPA funds will have fueled the construction of approximately 13,250 miles of fiber to over 112,380 BSLs.

Notably, all ARPA funds were deployed six months ahead of federal deadlines, and the result accrues to the benefit of South Carolinians because all ARPA-related construction work is also scheduled to be completed six months early – June 30, 2026.

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As of June 30, 2024, there were an estimated 150,705 underserved BSLs (impacting over 337,000 residents) in South Carolina; however, when construction on currently funded projects – including state, ARPA SLFRF, ARPA CPF, USDA ReConnect, and FCC Rural Digital Opportunity Funds – completes, the number of underserved BSLs is expected to fall to approximately 31,750 by 2030.

Statewide, over 1.9 million residents (86%) now subscribe to high-speed internet, and over 500,000 South Carolinians (approximately 20%) now have high-speed fiber in their homes.

When the additional \$546 million of Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) funding is approved later in 2024, the SCBBO estimates that it will have more than sufficient funds to provide access for the remaining 31,750 residential and business locations in South Carolina. Therefore, the end of the South Carolina digital divide is in sight.

#### **Digital Opportunity Department**

On October 1, 2023, the responsibility for Digital Equity (DE) transferred from the SC Department of Administration to the ORS and is now called the South Carolina Digital Opportunity Department (SCDOD).

The SCDOD focuses on opportunities to educate South Carolinians on how broadband access and adoption can enhance the state's workforce and individuals' lives. The National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) approved South Carolina's DE Plan (submitted to the NTIA by SCDOD in February of 2024) on April 2, 2024. This five-year plan is designed to help bridge the digital divide through enhanced broadband adoption and use.

In March 2024, the NTIA announced South Carolina's allocation in the DE State Capacity Program in the amount of approximately \$12.8 million to begin implementing the DE Plan. Funds are expected to be disbursed in October 2024 or later.

#### **SC Equipment Distribution Program**

The South Carolina Equipment Distribution Program (SCEDP), housed within the ORS, helps consumers who are deaf or have hearing or speech challenges by providing them with specialized telephone equipment. The program received and reviewed 596 applications; approved 493 applications; and conducted installations for 78 SCEDP clients, which included training on how to use the specialized telephone equipment.

In FY 23-24, SCEDP's outreach included distribution of approximately 2,400 publications and printed materials statewide. In addition, SCEDP staff gave presentations around the state to speech-language pathologists, medical professionals, and other organizations serving citizens who may have a hearing or speech challenge. These presentations raise awareness among those who serve clients that may qualify for SCEDP services. Additional presentations at senior

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centers and senior expos reach the target population directly. Over 50 presentations and exhibits were made in FY 23-24.

#### **State Energy Office**

The State Energy Office, housed within the ORS, advances South Carolina's energy strategy and policy through education and outreach. Under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), the State Energy Office received (in the prior fiscal year, FY 22-23) a five-year formula award totaling \$6.8 million via the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) State Energy Program (SEP). This additional SEP funding will enable the SC Energy Office to implement several recommendations from former and ongoing energy-planning stakeholder processes.

The State Energy Office allocated a portion of South Carolina's IIJA funding toward the opportunity to provide a fresh look at our state's energy strategy as contemplated by the South Carolina Energy Efficiency Act.

In FY 23-24, the State Energy Office developed a statement of work for a consultant to assist with the refresh of the 2016 State Energy Plan. Per Executive Order 2023-18, the ORS and the State Energy Office are drafting the final scope of work, which will then be shared with the powerSC Interagency Working Group and the PURC. The State Energy Office received emergency procurement authority and will begin the process of working with the State Procurement Office to expediently select the right consultant. This process will continue in FY 24-25.

Updating the State Energy Plan will be a multi-year effort to provide South Carolina with a current, comprehensive energy strategy, and it will require a great deal of collaboration across the public and private sectors.

**Electric Vehicle Stakeholder Initiative**. The State Energy Office released the Electric Vehicle (EV) Stakeholder Initiative Report (the EVSI Report) on September 21, 2022. The EVSI Report summarizes opportunities to advance EV deployment in South Carolina. It features the collaborative work of over 350 diverse stakeholders to examine the legislative and regulatory landscape for EV access and adoption, identify challenges and opportunities, and develop actionable recommendations for South Carolina.

In FY 23-24, the State Energy Office conducted a survey to assess EV-related activities in South Carolina. Pursuant to state statute, the State Energy Office will publish survey results and updates to the EVSI Report.

**Financial Support.** In FY 23-24, the Energy Office saved the public approximately \$15.5 million through a variety of energy initiatives. The Energy Office administers federal financial assistance to support public and private entities investing in energy-saving programs. Examples include:

- Approved \$68,250 in energy-efficiency tax credits
- Promoted energy efficiency, renewable energy, and clean transportation among public and private entities and nonprofits through four low-interest loan/grant programs:

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ConserFund, mini-grants, SC Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (SC EECBG) program, and the Energy Efficiency Revolving Loan (EERL) program. The State Energy Office has provided financial support in a variety of ways:

- Completed one previously awarded ConserFund Loan resulting in projected lifetime savings to borrowers of over \$1.6 million. No new ConserFund loans were awarded during this reporting period.
- Awarded and completed one EERL loan resulting in projected lifetime savings of over \$569,000.
- Completed four mini-grant projects totaling \$30,660 for public and non-profit entities to spur innovation and save over \$257,952 over the useful life of the projects. Three of the mini-grant projects were awarded in the previous reporting period. The remaining project was one of seven mini-grant awards issued in the current reporting period, totaling \$68,829. The other six mini-projects are expected to be completed in the next reporting period.
- Retrofitted 21 buildings comprising 2,359,177 square feet.
- Initiated the SC Competitive Energy Efficiency Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) subgrant program available to smaller units of local government to implement qualifying energy efficiency projects. Following two rounds of applications, the State Energy Office selected 19 projects. Four grant award agreements were executed in FY 23-24; the remaining 15 agreements are anticipated to be executed in the next fiscal year.
- Applied for and received early administrative funding to engage a consultant to apply for, design, and implement two federally funded rebate programs for residential homeowners under the Inflation Reduction Act.

#### Safety

**Pipeline Safety**. In partnership with the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), the ORS Pipeline Safety Program maintained responsibility for 25,944 miles of natural gas pipeline serving 951,809 customers.

ORS Pipeline Safety inspectors conducted a total of **153** inspections in FY 23-24 and responded to **43** technical gas pipeline safety-related inquiries from the public, operators, and contractors.

The Pipeline Safety Program received favorable results from the annual audit conducted by PHMSA. For the program evaluation, the ORS received a 98 out of 100 (98%). A one-point deduction was due to an administrative procedure error that has now been corrected. The other one-point deduction was because the ORS did not issue any fines; instead of issuing fines, the ORS has been very successful in developing a cooperative approach with operators to correct identified deficiencies.

On the progress report, the agency scored 46 out of 50 (92%) because the civil penalty amounts in South Carolina statutes did not match the federal level of civil penalty amounts. However, PHMSA acknowledged that with the May 2024 passage of House Bill 5154 to increase the fine amounts, ORS Pipeline Safety should be able to earn those points in future audits.

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**ESF 12 Emergency Response.** The ESF 12 staff stays trained and prepared for emergencies through participation in multiple readiness-training exercises. For example, ESF 12 staff members participated in the state full-scale emergency exercise during the first week of March 2024. The simulated emergency involved an earthquake in the Charleston area.

When not in activation mode, ESF 12 members also engage in collaborations to discuss and plan best practices in the event of an emergency. In FY 23-24, for example, ESF 12 continued to participate in the EMP (electromagnetic pulse/ resiliency) working group. This group of county emergency managers focuses on mitigation or consequence management during times of a long-term power outage caused by an EMP lapse or cyber-attack.

**Rail Safety.** In partnership with the Federal Railroad Administration, the ORS Rail Safety Program continued inspections of South Carolina's infrastructure to maximize the safety of the state's railroad system.

Inspectors conducted both track and operating practices (OP) inspections around the state. For the track and OP disciplines combined, ORS inspectors conducted 242 rail safety inspections and issued 277 rail safety defect citations. Staff responded to 75 technical railroad safety-related inquiries from railroads, industry, and the public. Inspectors also conducted 57 incident investigations.

#### **Administration**

**Budget.** The ORS regularly and carefully monitors expenditures to ensure resources are managed to accomplish the agency's mission, goals, and objectives. Critical to accomplishing our mission is the management of budget resources to retain, train, and add to our team of skilled professionals.

<u>FY 23-24 ORS Budget</u>. The ORS budget for FY 23-24 was \$21.4 million and included the following program areas: ORS, SC Energy Office, Dual Party Relay, Broadband Office, and Santee Cooper Oversight.

<u>Calendar Year 2023 USF (Universal Service Fund) Financial Statement Audit.</u> The ORS is administrator of the SC Universal Service Fund (USF), which provides monetary support for telecommunications services in South Carolina. The objective of the audit is to obtain an independent opinion as to whether the financial statements of the USF are fairly presented.

The 2023 Audited Financial Statements have been issued; the opinion is an "unqualified opinion," which is a clean opinion.

<u>Grants</u>. The ORS has received, or is in the process of receiving, significant federal funding in the SC Broadband Office, the State Energy Office, and the recently formed Digital Opportunity Department. Finance and program staff have proactively instituted internal controls and are taking all necessary steps in the prudent administration, management, and use of these federal dollars.

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**Agency Staffing.** ORS executive leadership continues to make organizational changes that better position the ORS for the future. The ORS has strategically hired new staff, as well as promoted from within the agency, to ensure that the agency can excel in carrying out all its responsibilities. The ORS consistently evaluates the need for additional positions, especially given the amount of federal funding coming to the agency. Some positions may be grant-limited positions.

#### **Implementation of Technology**

**New Department Formed.** As the ORS has grown, the Information Technology (IT) needs of the ORS have evolved significantly and will continue to do so. With that in mind, the ORS expanded its IT department in FY 23-24 by creating a new organizational area known as Technology Solutions and Outreach (TSO). Having a TSO department provides a way to consolidate and streamline technology functions and technology-driven outreach functions.

**SCBBO Construction Dashboard.** In FY 23-24, the SCBBO collaborated with Ookla and IBM to create the SCBBO Construction Dashboard (the Dashboard). The Dashboard enables the SCBBO to capture proof from consumers that they have subscribed to service and that the networks function at federally mandated speeds. This determination is essential because the ORS does not reimburse Internet Service Providers until broadband projects are 100% complete. Currently, the SCBBO is using the Dashboard for internal purposes only. The long-term vision is to make it fully public for consumers' use.

#### **Looking Ahead**

In FY 23-24, the ORS received major programmatic funding in the SC Broadband Office and the SC Energy Office resulting from the passage of federal legislation; both programs are preparing for an influx of more funding in the coming fiscal years. In addition, the newly formed Digital Opportunity Department will be receiving federal funding in the next year.

The ORS will continue to implement recent laws and regulations in the regulatory arena including, among others, Act 227, Act 90, Act 56, the SC Energy Freedom Act (Act 62), and the Broadband Accessibility Act.

The ORS continuously monitors potential changes that may affect the regulatory landscape. In April 2024, the EPA issued a prepublication version of its final carbon pollution standards for power plants that, according to the EPA website, "[s]et carbon dioxide (CO2) limits for new gasfired combustion turbines and CO2 emission guidelines for existing coal, oil and gas-fired steam generating units..." The rule was signed by the EPA Administrator on April 24, 2024, and was submitted for publication in the Federal Register. According to the language in the rule, it was effective 60 days after publication in the Federal Register.

The ORS filed comments on the then-proposed rule in August of 2023 stating its position that the then-proposed rule had the potential to dangerously undermine the reliability of the grid,

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place an unreasonable financial burden on consumers, and cause immediate and irreparable harm to South Carolina consumers and the state economy.

As of this writing, the ORS is currently evaluating the rule, how it intersects with the ORS' statutory mission, and how it may be affected by the recent U.S. Supreme Court ruling that overturned the Chevron doctrine, a longstanding principle whereby a federal agency's interpretation of its own ambiguous statutes was given deference by the courts. If appropriate, the ORS plans to represent the public interest before the EPA and may work with other state agencies in this effort.

#### **Risk and Mitigation Strategies**

If the ORS does not fulfill its mission of representing the public interest in utility regulation, the adverse consequences for consumers could be 1) paying high, inequitable rates that exceed what is adequate for utilities to maintain service reliability or 2) paying rates that are too low for utilities to sustain reliable service to customers.



The ORS respectfully requests that the General Assembly continue to provide the following:

- 1) support from the General Assembly and the PURC;
- 2) a budget that allows the ORS to recruit, hire, and retain talented staff; and
- 3) the ability and funding to hire and retain outside experts as necessary.
