Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill is expected to have an expenditure impact on the General Fund and Other Funds. The annual expenditure to administer the new license program is estimated at \$57,895 in the first year and \$55,927 each year thereafter. Any fees collected from new internet or mail order service licensees would be used to offset the estimated expense. This bill would have no expenditure impact on Federal Funds.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

Senate Bill 167 amends Section 40-25-60, administered by the Department of Health and Environmental Control, related to the practice of specializing in hearing aids. This bill expands the hearing aid specialist license requirement to anyone who offers to sell hearing aids in this state through the mail, internet, or other means.

Department of Health and Environmental Control. The department indicates that the additional responsibility of licensing hearing aid specialists operating through the internet or mail services would require 1.00 new FTE for an Inspector III position. The increase in expenditures for salary, fringe benefits, and operating expenses is estimated at \$55,927 annually with a one-time first-year cost of \$1,968 for a computer and software.

State Revenue

The department currently issues licenses to 215 vendors annually and receives approximately \$9,000 in revenue. It is not possible to estimate the number of new licenses that might be issued

for internet or mail-order hearing aid specialists resulting from enactment of this bill. Any fees collected from new internet or mail order service licensees would be used to offset the estimated expense.
