Fiscal Impact Summary

The Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office is unable to determine the expenditure impact on state and local law enforcement agencies due to the permissive nature of the bill

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

Senate Bill 302 amends Section 23-1-210 relating to transfers or assignments of law enforcement officers. The bill authorizes a law enforcement agency to enter into mutual aid agreements or multijurisdictional task force agreements with other law enforcement providers as may be necessary in the interests of public safety. The bill also removes the requirement that a transfer of officers must be temporary in nature. Finally, the bill provides that prior to any transfer or assignment, the concerned law enforcement agencies shall enter into written agreements stating the conditions and terms of the employment of officers to be transferred or assigned.

Due to the permissive nature of this bill allowing county and municipal law enforcement agencies to transfer law enforcement officers to participating jurisdictions, the Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office is unable to determine the expenditure impact on state law enforcement agencies.
