Fiscal Impact Summary

The expenditure impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC).

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Amended by House Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Environmental Affairs on February 15, 2018

State Expenditure

This bill updates terms and conditions for establishing two beachfront jurisdictional lines: the coastal baseline and setback lines. The bill specifies that DHEC must use the jurisdictional lines that were established as of January 31, 2012, for the period beginning January 1, 2016, and ending December 31, 2019. This bill stipulates that new baselines and setback lines must be initiated no later than December 31, 2023. DHEC must reestablish all baselines and setback lines in existence as of January 31, 2012. Current law requires DHEC to establish and review the baseline and setback lines every seven to ten years. DHEC completed its most recent review and proposed changes in October 2017. DHEC plans to adopt final revised beachfront jurisdictional lines in May 2018.

This bill also modifies the appeals process for decisions made by DHEC concerning jurisdictional lines. Currently, a landowner may request a review of the jurisdictional lines affecting his personal property for a fee of \$100. Current law stipulates that decisions arising from this review conference are to be mailed to the landowner or his representative, but does not

specify postal class. This bill specifies that review conference decisions are to be mailed by certified mail.

Department of Health and Environmental Control. This bill requires DHEC to establish new baseline and setback lines no later than December 31, 2023. This bill also requires all decisions made concerning the review of jurisdictional lines be sent by certified mail. The expenditure impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from DHEC.

Administrative Law Court. The agency reports that the implementation of this bill creates no new requirements for the agency. Therefore, this bill will have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Introduced on January 24, 2018 State Expenditure

This bill removes the restriction that the baseline may not move seaward of its current position on December 31, 2017. This bill stipulates that new baselines and setback lines must be established no later than December 31, 2023. DHEC must reestablish all baselines and setback lines in existence as of January 31, 2012. Current law requires DHEC to establish and review the baseline and setback lines every seven to ten years. DHEC completed its most recent review and proposed changes in October 2017. DHEC will begin to adopt final revised beachfront jurisdictional lines in May 2018.
