State Expenditure

This bill allows a person holding a concealed weapons permit to carry a weapon on the leased premises of an elementary or secondary school if a church leases the school premises for church services or activities. This approval is only upon the express permission of a church official or governing body and only during those times that the church has the use of the property. The provisions do not apply during any time students are present because of a school sponsored activity taking place on the school property.

The bill does not require any agency action and does not operationally or fiscally impact state agencies or local governments. Therefore, the bill does not have an expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.
