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### **Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill will not have a fiscal impact on the General Funds, Federal Funds, or Other Funds of the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) as it creates no new regulatory duties or expenditures for the agency.

### **Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

#### **Introduced on January 12, 2021**

##### **State Expenditure**

This bill changes the Newborn Screening Advisory Committee to the Newborn Screening and Rare Disease Council. To the existing duties of the committee, the bill adds advising the Governor, the General Assembly, and DHEC on research, diagnosis, treatment, and education relating to rare diseases. It also makes stipulations concerning the membership of the council.

**Department of Health and Environmental Control.** The Newborn Screening Advisory Committee is under the administration of DHEC. DHEC indicates that this bill does not materially alter the oversight or regulatory duties of the agency. Therefore, this bill will not have an expenditure impact on the General Funds, Federal Funds, or Other Funds of the department.
