**Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill adds both a state and national criminal records check to the list of requirements that the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) can enforce for the licensure of physical therapists and physical therapy assistants. The bill will have no expenditure impact on LLR as the duties required under the bill will be managed within the normal course of agency business.

The fiscal impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from SLED.

**Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

**Introduced on January 12, 2021**

**State Expenditure**

This bill adds both a state and national criminal records check to the list of requirements that LLR may require for the licensure of physical therapists and physical therapy assistants.

**Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation.** This bill adds that LLR may require physical therapists and physical therapy assistants to have a background check performed and submitted, at the expense of the applicant, with their applications for licensure. These operations can be conducted with existing staff and resources. Therefore, there will be no expenditure impact to LLR.

**State Law Enforcement Division.** The expenditure impact of this bill on SLED is pending, contingent upon a response from the agency.

**State Revenue**

This bill may increase the number of state criminal records checks that SLED is required to perform. Pursuant to Section 23-3-115(A), revenue generated by state criminal records checks performed by SLED up to an amount of \$4,461,000 must be deposited in the General Fund. Any revenue over that amount is retained by SLED. The revenue impact of this bill on the General Fund and the Other Funds of SLED is pending, contingent upon a response from the agency.
