Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill establishes the nineteenth day of June, or Juneteenth, as a legal holiday in South Carolina and allows that State employees may select, prior to each year, either Confederate Memorial Day, Juneteenth, or an alternative day of their choice for holiday leave. We anticipate that this bill will have no expenditure impact on state agencies because no additional day of leave is provided for State employees, only the option of when to take a day of holiday leave.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill establishes the nineteenth day of June, or Juneteenth, as a legal holiday in South Carolina and allows that State employees may select, prior to each year, either Confederate Memorial Day, Juneteenth, or an alternative day of their choice for holiday leave. We anticipate that this bill will have no expenditure impact on state agencies because no additional day of leave is provided for State employees, only the option of when to take a day of holiday leave. This bill establishes the nineteenth day of June, or Juneteenth, as a legal holiday in South Carolina. We anticipate that this bill will result in the closing of all state buildings and offices except for certain agencies that must provide 24-hour services. These agencies may experience

an expenditure impact to cover any potential pay out of compensatory time for employees who must work on the newly created holiday. However, the expenditure impact of this bill is pending, contingent upon a response from Admin.
