Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill allows the South Carolina Building Codes Council (council), which is under the administration of the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR), to deny a code committee's report of recommendations with at least a two-thirds vote. Additionally, the bill updates the effective date of building codes for both residential and commercial building codes. There is no fiscal impact to LLR because the bill requires the council to perform activities that will be conducted in the normal course of agency business.
