Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill allows the House Ways and Means Committee and Senate Finance Committee to designate one representative from each respective body to the advisory council that supports the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Resource Coordination Center (center).

This bill will have no expenditure impact for the House of Representatives (House) or the Senate. Currently, members of the center's advisory council are not entitled to mileage, per diem, or any other form of compensation. However, House and Senate members may receive reimbursements at the discretion of the Speaker of the House and President of the Senate, respectively. The House and Senate have indicated that, if any reimbursements are deemed appropriate, these expenses can be managed within current House or Senate appropriations.

Additionally, this bill will have no expenditure impact for The Department of Aging (Aging), as the agency indicates that this bill does not alter the receptibilities of the agency.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 14, 2025 **State Expenditure**

This bill allows the House Ways and Means Committee and Senate Finance Committee to designate one representative from each respective body to the advisory council that supports the center.

Currently, members of the council are not entitled to mileage, per diem, or any other form of compensation. However, House and Senate members may receive reimbursements at the discretion of the Speaker of the House and President of the Senate, respectively. The House and Senate have indicated that, if any reimbursements are deemed appropriate, these expenses can be managed within current House or Senate appropriations. Therefore, this bill will have no fiscal impact on the House or Senate.

Aging houses the center whose purpose is to provide statewide coordination, service system development, information and referral, and caregiver support services to individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, their families, and caregivers. Aging indicates this bill does not impact the responsibilities of the agency. Therefore, this bill will have no fiscal impact on Aging.
