Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill allows a law enforcement officer, circuit solicitor, or the Attorney General to require the disclosure of stored communications, as well as related transaction records and subscriber information, to the extent provided by federal law.

This bill will have no expenditure impact for Judicial, the Commission on Prosecution Coordination (Prosecution), the Office of the Attorney General (AG), or the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED). Judicial indicates that caseloads in general sessions and summary courts may be impacted by this bill, and judges and staff will need to undergo training in order to comply with this bill. Judicial further indicates that any additional expenses can be managed within existing appropriations. However, if this bill results in a significant increase in the workload, Judicial will request an increase in General Fund appropriations. Additionally, Prosecution, AG, and SLED indicate that the responsibilities of this bill will be managed with existing staff and resources.


